Large-Ticket Deals Power Industrial & Warehousing Leasing to 36.9 Mn Sq Ft in 2025

Hyderabad / New Delhi, Jan 14 (FN Reporter)

India's industrial and warehousing real estate market recorded its strongest performance in recent years, with 36.9 million sq ft of leasing in 2025, registering a 16% year-on-year growth, according to a report released by Colliers India. The momentum was largely driven by large-sized transactions, which accounted for 45% of total leasing activity, underlining occupiers' preference for scalable, Grade A logistics assets, the report revealed. Delhi NCR and Chennai emerged as the leading markets, together accounting for over 45% of the total

leasing volume during the year. Delhi NCR led with a 24% share, followed closely by Chennai at 22%, supported by strong manufacturing clusters and improving infrastructure connectivity, the report said. Leasing activity gained pace in the final quarter of 2025, with Q4 alone contributing 10.4 million sq ft. Chennai and Pune together made up 56% of the quarterly demand, signalling renewed occupier confidence after a relatively muted third quarter.

From an occupier perspective, Third-Party Logistics (3PL) players continued to

dominate demand, accounting for 32% of Grade A space uptake, or nearly 12 million sq ft during the year, it said. Engineering and e-commerce occupiers also remained active, and collectively contributed about 35% of the annual leasing activity. Large-format warehousing requirements were particularly evident in the e-commerce segment, where 61% of leasing occurred through transactions exceeding 200,000 sq ft, driven by the expansion of fulfilment centres and delivery hubs. In contrast, FMCG and retail occupiers preferred mid-sized facilities, reflecting the



growing adoption of hyperlocal distribution models.

At the micro-market level, Bhiwandi (Mumbai) led leasing activity with approximately 4.9 million sq ft of Grade A absorption, followed by Chakan-Talegaon (Pune) and Oragadam (Chennai), each recording over 2.5 million sq ft of demand. On the supply side, developers remained bullish on long-term prospects. New completions touched 41.7 million sq ft in 2025, marking a 15% annual increase and the highest supply addition in recent years. 'Cities need to be prepared for accommodating, enabling rapid economic growth'

New Delhi, Jan 14 (Reporter)



Cities are important when it comes to supporting and driving economic growth of a nation, playing pivotal role as growth hubs in an economy. Speaking to UNI, retired IAS Dr OP Agarwal, a known expert on urban transport, climate change, and public policy, said that all those economies that have witnessed rapid growth, have seen expansion in the manufacturing and services sector, adding that these activities usually happen in the urban areas. He emphasized that urban areas need to be prepared to accommodate and also enable the rapid growth of the economy in the journey to becoming a developed one. To realise the right balance of growth and development in the major cities, he stated that the planning of infrastructure needs to be based on an economic vision and not as per the traditional process, which is incremental, and does not take into account future economic growth as a driver.

He stated that a very important aspect related to a city is the vulnerability to disasters, which is much higher in the cities, given their density and the need is to prepare the urban areas for these challenges. It was the Covid pandemic, earthquakes, or floods that clearly proved how urban areas are vulnerable to emergencies and disasters, making them susceptible to damage. Talking of efficient and future-proof master planning for cities, Agarwal said that factors like key economic drivers that determine the infrastructure needs must be taken into account, and also the land requirements for such needs. He suggested that what has been recognised is that there is a need to build capacity at the municipal level, state level, and the national level to deeply understand these challenges and also look at how these can be dealt with. Throwing light on the issue of increase in the population in bigger cities like Delhi, he said that good planning is very important. He also laid emphasis on the importance of knowing what kind of physical and social infrastructure is required in the city, and also how much land is required ► **Cont. to Page-7**

Iran vows retaliation as US threats rise; India asks citizens to leave

New Delhi/ Teheran, Jan 14 (Agency) Iran's defence minister warned on Wednesday that the country had "many surprises" in store for any adversary that attacked it, as tensions with the United States escalated sharply and weeks of deadly protests continued to rock Teheran. The Iranian bravado followed an intensification of rhetoric from President Donald Trump, who has suggested the United States could intervene militarily as Iran's leadership struggles to contain unrest that began late last year over worsening economic conditions. Many countries including India issued travel advisories asking citizens to return from Iran and those planning to travel to the Islamic republic to stay away. "If these threats are turned into action, we will defend the country with full force and until the last drop of blood," Iranian defence minister, ► **Cont. to Page-7**

Jaishankar, Rubio discuss trade, defence, and critical minerals in telephonic call

India's wholesale price inflation edged higher in December 2025, with the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) based inflation rising to 0.83 per cent year-on-year, reflecting increased prices in manufactured goods and select primary articles, according to official data released on Tuesday. On a monthly basis, wholesale prices increased by 0.71 per cent in December compared to November, indicating a mild build-up in price pressures at the producer level. The overall WPI stood at 157.0 during the month, based on

the 2011-12 base year.

Manufactured products, which carry the highest weight in the WPI basket, recorded an annual inflation of 1.82



per cent, driven by higher prices of machinery and equipment, textiles, food products, chemicals, and transport equipment. The rise in manufactured goods inflation suggests firm demand

conditions and higher input costs across industrial segments. Primary articles showed mixed price movements, with moderation in some food items even as prices of minerals and non-food articles registered increases. Fuel and power prices remained largely stable, offering some relief to overall wholesale inflation during the month. The food index, which includes food articles and food products, recorded zero inflation on a year-on-year basis in December, indicating stable food prices compared to the same period last year. Prices of cereals such as wheat and paddy showed varied trends, helping contain food-related inflationary pressures.

Japanese PM likely to call snap poll, plans to capitalise on personal popularity

Tokyo, Jan 14 (Agency)

Japan's PM Sanae Takaichi is preparing to call a snap general election, aiming to capitalise on her strong personal approval ratings and secure a clear mandate for her government, according to her coalition partner. Takaichi informed senior colleagues on Wednesday that she intends to dissolve the lower house of parliament shortly after it reconvenes on January 23, Hirofumi Yoshimura said. Yoshimura leads the Japan Innovation Party, which entered a governing coalition with the ruling Liberal Democratic Party in October. While no election date has currently been finalised, Japanese media, citing

senior LDP figures, reports that a timeline between February 8-15 is the most likely scenario, as per Financial Times. LDP Secretary-General Shunichi Suzuki said Takaichi would set out further details at a press conference on January 19. Yoshimura said the coalition had discussed the election as an opportunity for the new government to seek public endorsement. "The current administration has not yet received a mandate through a general election," he told reporters, describing a snap poll as a way to build legitimacy and trust. Takaichi took office late last year after winning the LDP's leadership race, becoming Japan's first woman PM, marking a historic milestone in Japanese politics. ► **Cont. to Page-7**

IIT-Bhubaneswar research team develops satellite remote sensing tech for bauxite prospecting

A group of researchers from Indian Institute of Technology (IIT)-Bhubaneswar identified potential bauxite depositional sites at a regional-scale across Odisha's Koraput and Rayagada districts using advanced hyper-spectral satellite remote sensing.

The study conducted by Ashim Sattar, Assistant Professor and his research group integrated hyper spectral satellite data, field surveys, geochemical and petrographic assessments, and laboratory spectral studies. Together, these techniques provide a robust framework for first-order mapping of potential bauxite deposits. This pioneering study marks ► **Cont. to Page-7**

India set for 7.4 per cent growth in FY26 as inflation eases: SBI Caps

New Delhi, Jan 14 (Representative)

India is poised for a relatively stable growth trajectory in FY26, supported by resilient domestic demand, government-led capital expenditure, and easing inflationary pressures, even as global uncertainties continue to cloud the outlook, according to SBI Capital Markets' latest EcoCapsule report. It projects India's real GDP growth at 7.4 per cent year-on-year in FY26, driven by strong consumption and sustained public capex. The rural demand has received a boost from favourable monsoons

and tax reforms, while government capital spending has risen sharply up 28 percent year-on-year in the first eight months of FY26, with roads and railways leading the push. Globally, growth has proven more resilient than initially feared despite heightened trade tensions. While tariff announcements by the US had earlier triggered sharp downgrades to global growth forecasts, expectations have since stabilised, with global output projected to expand by 3.2% in calendar year 2025, supported by steady growth in the US, China, and India. On the policy front, easing

inflation has allowed central banks to cut rates, though long-term bond yields remain elevated.



In India, inflation slipping below the Reserve Bank of India's comfort

band prompted a surprise rate cut in December 2025, capping a year marked by aggressive monetary easing. Food and energy prices have been key contributors to the disinflation trend, while core inflation remains relatively sticky. Financial markets, however, reflected mixed signals. Foreign portfolio investors recorded net equity outflows during the year, even as domestic institutional investors stepped in, helping capital markets deliver a resilient performance. Equity IPO fundraising rose 8% year-on-year to Rs 1.72 trillion, while infrastructure

investment trusts (InvITs) and REITs attracted record inflows. Looking ahead, SBI Caps cautions that FY27 could test growth momentum as fiscal constraints tighten for both the Centre and states. The report underscores the need for a stronger pickup in private sector capital expenditure to sustain medium-term growth, especially in emerging and technology-led sectors, as public finances face increasing pressure. The outlook for 2026 is described as one of "tempered optimism," less volatile than recent years, but still vulnerable to global shocks ranging from geopolitics to commodity price swings.

Dr Reddy's launches first to market OTC antihistamine eye drop



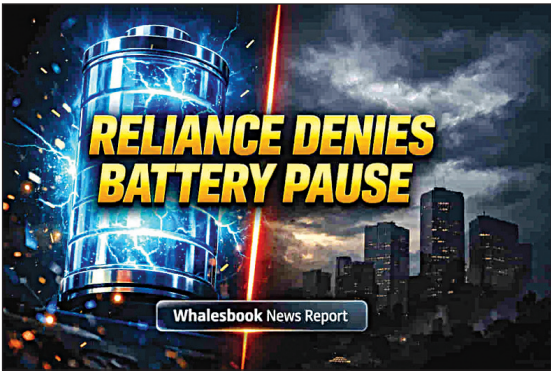

Reliance denies bottlenecks, confirms that Battery Manufacturing on track

Mumbai, Jan 14 (Reporter)

Reliance Industries has officially announced that its plans to manufacture lithium-ion battery cell storage in India remain unchanged and are progressing in line with target timelines, in response to reports in a section of the media that the company has backtracked from plans announced earlier after it failed to secure Chinese technology. The Mukesh Ambani-led group, which planned to begin cell manufacturing in 2026, was in discussions with Chinese firm Xiamen Hithium Energy Storage Technology to license battery cell technology, but a recent report had claimed that these plans were put on

hold after the talks failed. The report had suggested that negotiations came to a standstill after Xiamen withdrew from the proposed partnership in response to China's restrictions on knowledge transfers abroad in important areas.



However, it has now emerged that Reliance is in a position to draw upon

the expertise of its US subsidiary Lithium Werks, which is well versed in LFP (lithium-iron-phosphate) batteries, as well as its UK subsidiary Faradion, to manufacture higher-performance lithium-ion automotive batteries.

"We would like to categorically affirm that there has been no change in our plans for creating a world-leading battery storage manufacturing ecosystem from cell to containerised ESS, and they are progressing well in line with our target timelines," according to a statement issued by a company spokesperson. Previously, Reliance had indicated 2026 as the target when it would begin manufacturing battery cells in India. Reliance Industries Chairman & Managing Director Mukesh Ambani told shareholders in August

last year that Reliance's battery giga factory would start in 2026, beginning with a 40 GWh per year capacity and then expanding it to 100 GWh per year. "You will note that BESS manufacturing, battery pack manufacturing and cell manufacturing have always been part of our energy storage plans, and we are progressing well in their execution, as already shared earlier," according to the Reliance spokesperson. Reliance has committed Rs 75,000 crore to establish an integrated manufacturing ecosystem for the solar value chain, battery energy storage systems (BESS) and electrolyzers at Jamnagar, Gujarat at its Dhirubhai Ambani Green Energy Giga Manufacturing Complex. The facility is what Reliance says is the world's largest, most modern, modular and integrated manufacturing ecosystem at a single site.

India is likely to record a GDP growth of 7.5–7.8 percent in FY26; likely to moderate in FY27: Deloitte

India is likely to record a GDP growth of 7.5–7.8 percent in the current financial year (FY2025-26), supported by strong festive demand and robust performance in the services sector, Deloitte India said on Wednesday. Growth is expected to moderate to 6.6–6.9 percent in FY2026-27, reflecting a high base and continued global uncertainties. In its outlook, Deloitte said, "2025 will be remembered as a year of resilience for India's domestic demand, marked by decisive reforms in fiscal, monetary, and labour policies, along with a recalibration of trade strategies amid a challenging global environment." India's real GDP grew 8 percent during the first half of FY26 (April–September) despite global headwinds such as trade disruptions, policy shifts in advanced economies, and volatile capital flows. Deloitte noted that early signs of external risks in 2025, including unpredictable trade policies, geopolitical tensions, and slowing growth among major trading partners, prompted timely policy intervention. Measures such as tax exemptions, policy rate cuts, and GST rationalisation were introduced to stimulate demand, while favourable inflation trends provided additional support to economic activity. On the trade front, India undertook significant recalibration efforts. The country signed key free trade agreements with the UK, New Zealand, and Oman, initiated negotiations with Israel, and operationalised the EFTA trade deal in 2025, aimed at export diversification. India also strengthened trade and investment engagement with emerging economies across Asia, Africa, and the Middle East, aligning with the broader Global South shift, Deloitte said.

Raj: Dr Karan Singh's biography to be unveiled at JLF 2026 on Thursday

A much-awaited book on the life and legacy of erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir princely state’s royal and renowned statesman, Dr Karan Singh, will be unveiled at Jaipur Literature Festival 2026 that begins here tomorrow. The book, "The Extraordinary Life and Legacy of Dr Karan Singh", is authorised biography of the nonagenarian Statesman and public figure. The book is authored by Harbans Singh. This examines the remarkable journey of one of India’s most distinguished public figures—a statesman, scholar, humanist and spiritual seeker—whose story is inextricably linked not only to Jammu and Kashmir’s journey, but also to India’s journey as a nation and a society since Independence. Roy, followed by a conversation between Dr Karan Singh, author Harbans Singh and publisher Ravi Singh. While this

Karan Singh was just 18 years old, and had barely recovered from a mysterious illness that left him bedridden for over a year, when he was catapulted into political life in 1949. His father, the last King of Jammu and Kashmir who had recently signed the Instrument of Accession to India, appointed him Regent and left the State, never to return. Over the next 18 years, Karan Singh presided over J&K’s difficult transition to a modern but troubled democracy—first as Regent, then as Head of State (Sadr-e-Riyasat) and finally as Governor. In 1967, he resigned as Governor of J&K and joined Indira Gandhi led Congress government, becoming India’s youngest cabinet minister. He had served as union Minister of Tourism and Aviation, Health, and Education and Culture. Singh was also India’s Ambassador to the USA, head of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations

(ICCR), Member of the Rajya Sabha, Chairman of the Auroville Foundation and member of the UNESCO Executive Board. Throughout, he has remained of independent mind and spirit—a gentleman and a consensus-builder in the fractious world of Indian politics, and a celebrated scholar of Hinduism who has championed interfaith understanding for over half a century. Together with his political journey, he has made a singular journey as a philosopher and spiritual seeker, trying to understand life’s ultimate purpose and meaning. Meticulously researched and both intimate and objective, A Statesman and a Seeker tells the story of Karan Singh’s extraordinary life and legacy—and his fascinating encounters with, among others, Jawaharlal Nehru, Sardar Patel, Sheikh Abdullah, Lal Bahadur Shastri, Indira Gandhi, J.R.D. Tata, Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Rajiv Gandhi, Aldous Huxley, and the spiritual gurus Sri Krishnaprem and Sri Madhav Ashish. At 94, Dr Karan Singh remains one of India’s most remarkable and respected public personalities.

Heritage Foods seeks policy support for organised dairy in upcoming union Budget

Hyderabad, Jan 14 (Reporter)

Ahead of the union Budget 2026, Heritage Foods Ltd Executive Director Brahmani Nara on Tuesday called for targeted policy support to accelerate growth in India’s organised dairy sector, citing favourable market conditions following the September 2025 GST rationalisation. In a statement, Brahmani said the GST changes have boosted organised dairy players, with consumers increasingly shifting toward high-protein and health-focused products such as paneer, cheese, ghee and butter. She said government-led initiatives, including the Rashtriya Gokul Mission and the National Digital Livestock Mission, are helping to integrate more than 300,000 farmers associated with Heritage Foods into the organised dairy ecosystem. Outlining expectations from the upcoming Budget, she highlighted three key priorities including subsidised access to quality cattle feed and chromosome-sorted semen to improve animal productivity, expansion of veterinary education infrastructure to address the shortage of veterinarians, and higher capital subsidies for mini-dairy units, particularly those led by women entrepreneurs. India currently has around 68,000 registered veterinarians against an estimated requirement of 1.1 to 1.2 lakh, she noted, stressing that addressing this gap is critical for sustaining the government’s aggressive dairy expansion plans. Enhanced support for small and decentralised dairy units, she added, would also help generate rural employment and strengthen milk procurement networks.

Stock market ends lower in volatile session

New Delhi, Jan 14 (FN Representative)

The Indian Stock markets ended lower in a volatile session today, with the BSE Sensex falling by 244.98 points or 0.29 per cent to 83,382.71 and the NSE Nifty declining by 66.70 points or 0.26 pc to 25,665.60. The Mid-cap and Small-cap segments also outperformed as the BSE Mid-cap and Small-cap indices closed the day 0.16 pc and 0.25 pc higher, respectively. Among the sectors, those recorded gains were Nifty Metal up by 2.70 pc and PSU Bank up by 2.13 pc. Most of the other sectoral indices ended lower. Nifty IT was down 1.08 pc, Realty, Auto and FMCG declined by over half a pc each. Further, the Nifty Bank ended flat, but the Financial Services index eased by 0.31 pc. Top gainers on Nifty were Tata Steel (3.71 pc), NTPC (3.28 pc), and Axis Bank (2.93 pc) while Asian Paints (2.40 pc), TCS (2.15 pc), and Tata Consumer (1.72 pc) ended as the top losers. Out of 4,344 stocks traded on the BSE, 2,017 advanced, while 2,150 declined and some 177 stocks remained unchanged. Over 150 stocks hit 52-week low. Some of the notable ones on lows were Poly Medicare, Tube Investment, Cohanee Life, Godrej Properties, Whirlpool of India, Dixon Technologies, Bata India, IRCTC, Happiest Minds, ITC, Brainbees Solutions. In terms of the realty stocks, Prestige Estates shares fell around 2 pc, Macrotech Developers (Lodha), Brigade Enterprises and Phoenix Mills shares fell over 1 pc, Anant Raj and Godrej Properties shares fell around 1 pc. Tata Elxsi emerged as the top laggard among Nifty 500 stocks, falling 5.3 pc to Rs 5,485 apiece. Polycab India slipped another 3 pc to settle at Rs 7,323 apiece. Market will remain shut on Thursday, January 15, on account of municipal corporation elections in Maharashtra.

Godrej incorporates subsidiary to enhance financial services presence

Mumbai, Jan 14 (Representative)

Godrej Industries Ltd (GIL) has officially announced that it has incorporated a new subsidiary, called Godrej Investment Ltd, as its financial services arm, which will serve as an umbrella holding company for all group financial operations, including its lending businesses. The incorporation of Godrej Investment Ltd came after the Godrej Industries Ltd board’s approval on August 13, 2025 and shareholder approval on September 29, 2025. The move is designed to create a cleaner corporate structure, simplify borrowing, facilitate equity partnerships, and potentially pave the way for future demergers of mature

businesses. Incorporation documents related to Godrej Investment Ltd have outlined objectives which include trading in stocks, debt instruments, Infrastructure Investment Trusts (InvITs), Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) and alternative investment funds. Godrej Industries Ltd will subscribe to 100 per cent of the shareholding in Godrej Investment Ltd. While Godrej Investment Ltd is a related party transaction by virtue of being a wholly owned subsidiary, the transaction itself is structured as a cash consideration for the share subscription. The new subsidiary which will operate in the financial services business sector has not yet commenced operations, though it has completed all regulatory disclosures under

SEBI’s listing regulations to the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) and the National Stock Exchange (NSE). The group’s present lending operations, housed under Godrej Capital Ltd, encompass Godrej Housing Finance Ltd as well as Godrej Finance Ltd, which is a Non-Banking Financial Company (NBFC). As of March 31, 2025, these businesses managed Assets Under Management (AUM) worth Rs 16,930 crore. Earlier, Godrej Capital had announced that it plans to close FY26 with assets under management (AUM) at over Rs 25,000 crore. Godrej Capital’s Managing Director & CEO Manish Shah had stated that between FY27 and FY28, the company plans to nearly double its AUM to Rs 50,000 crore.

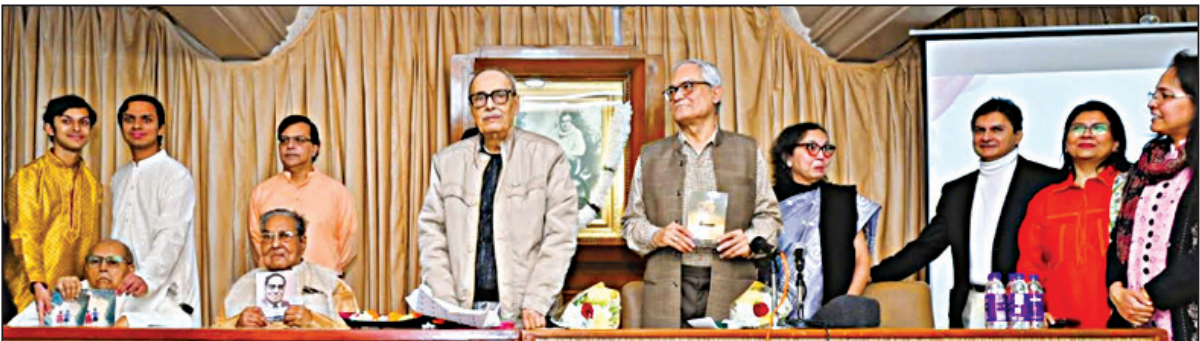

Tamil Nadu Commissions Integrated Reservoir Management Centre for Chennai



Building on the successful commissioning of the Urban Flood Management Centre (UFMC) in Gorakhpur, the Government of Tamil Nadu has commissioned the Integrated Reservoir Management Centre (IRMC) for Chennai, marking a significant step in strengthening flood preparedness and coordinated reservoir operations. The system powering the centre has been developed and integrated by Canarys Automations Limited (ISIN: INE0QG301017). The IRMC was formally inaugurated at the Indian Coast Guard Campus, Varuna Salai, Chennai, in the presence of the Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Thiru Udayanidhi Stalin, Hon'ble Minister for Water Resources Thiru Duraimurugan, and Hon'ble Minister for Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments (HR&CE) Thiru P. K. Sekar Babu. The IRMC was formally inaugurated on Tuesday, 6 January 2026, at the Indian Coast Guard Campus, Varuna Salai, Chennai, in the presence of the Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Thiru Udayanidhi Stalin, Hon'ble Minister for Water Resources, Thiru Duraimurugan, and Hon'ble Minister for Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments (HR&CE), Thiru P. K. Sekar Babu. At the core of the IRMC is the Autonomous Reservoir Decision-Making System (ARDMS), a technology platform that integrates flood early-warning capabilities, SCADA-controlled gate operations, IoT-based field sensors, and AI-ML driven decision intelligence. The system enables end-to-end, real-time reservoir operations in line with the 3R principle of reservoir management – Retention, Regulation, and Release. Speaking at the inauguration, Mr. Shyam Mantha, Senior Vice President – Sales & Marketing, Canarys Automations, said the commissioning of ARDMS represents a shift from manual and reactive dam operations to a more proactive, data-driven, and climate-resilient water management framework. He added that reservoir operations will now be centrally monitored and coordinated from the newly established IRMC at Varuna Salai, located within the Indian Coast Guard premises in Chennai. The system has been implemented to manage Chennai's three interlinked reservoirs—Poondi, Chembarabakkam, and Red Hills (Puzhal)—as a single integrated hydrological system. It uses inputs such as rainfall data, reservoir inflows, storage levels, gate positions, downstream river conditions, and tidal data to generate early-warning alerts and safe discharge recommendations. This integrated approach enables authorities to anticipate flood risks before they materialise, regulate reservoir releases in a controlled manner, protect downstream communities, and optimise water storage during dry periods. Designed to be scalable and adaptable, the platform can be extended to other dams and reservoirs across Tamil Nadu. With the commissioning of the IRMC, Canarys Automations reinforces its role in supporting state-led initiatives aimed at improving urban flood resilience and long-term water security. The company plans to continue deploying similar technology-driven solutions, combining automation with AI-ML capabilities, across other Indian cities and urban centres in the coming years.

From soil to muslin: Farmers' lives mapped at Students' Biennale in Kochi



Kochi, Jan 14 (Agency) A textile-based artwork that reflects the labour, memory, and lived experiences of Indian farmers is drawing attention at the 'Arthshila' venue of the Students' Biennale 2025. Titled 'Inheritance of the Hand', the work is a collaborative effort by artists Mohammad Riyaz and Aman Kumar. Riyaz, hailing from Gwalior in Madhya Pradesh, has completed his Master of Fine Arts from the Government College of Fine Arts, Gwalior. Shaped by his rural upbringing, his artistic practice centres on the everyday struggles of Indian farmers, a theme that runs through his current exhibits at the Students' Biennale. Recalling his childhood in a farming environment, Riyaz said he had witnessed repeated crop losses due to rain and fire, followed by prolonged and often unsuccessful efforts to secure compensation from government offices. "These experiences stayed with me and became questions I wanted to work through," he said. In 'Inheritance of the Hand', Riyaz employs tailoring techniques to stitch painted muslin, a material historically linked to India's colonial past. Sleeves shaped like hands form the central visual motif, symbolising labour, endurance, and effort. Through layered fabric and reconstructed garments, the work reflects both the dignity and burden carried by rural communities. The artwork was completed in Gwalior over a period of about one month. Riyaz said the technical process was the most challenging aspect, particularly handling the sewing machine and assembling the many sleeves, though the conceptual foundation came naturally from his personal experiences. The collaboration also features Aman Kumar's practice of weaving and painting on muslin. Drawing from stories and memories passed down by his grandmother, Kumar's work explores themes of generational loss. Together, the artists bring distinct personal histories into a shared visual narrative. According to Riyaz, visitors at Arthshila have been engaging closely with the work, with many spending time to reflect and ask questions. He described the response as encouraging and expressed gratitude to the Kochi Biennale Foundation and its curators for providing space and trust for his work. The Students' Biennale, a key educational initiative of the Kochi Biennale Foundation, offers a platform for young artists from public institutions across India to develop and present their work to a wider global audience. The Students' Biennale 2025-26, which opened on December 13, 2025, is being held alongside the sixth edition of the Kochi-Muziris Biennale. The programme is led by curators and collectives who mentor students from over 150 institutions across seven regions of the country, engaging with them, shortlisting exhibition participants, and working closely to develop projects for display in Kochi.

PNG for 250 homes ready in 100 days, Surya inaugurates

In a rare example of fast-tracked urban infrastructure delivery, a piped natural gas (PNG) network connecting 250 homes at SBI Colony in JP Nagar 1st Phase was completed in just 100 days and inaugurated on Wednesday by Bengaluru South MP Tejasvi Surya. The City Gas Distribution project, implemented by GAIL India,



has brought clean and safe piped natural gas directly to households, ending residents' dependence on LPG cylinders. The rapid execution of the project has drawn attention as a model for time-bound delivery of civic infrastructure in the city. Speaking at the inauguration, Surya said completing the project within 100 days demonstrates what coordinated efforts between government agencies, elected representatives and citizens can achieve. He

said PNG connectivity not only improves safety and convenience but also strengthens Bengaluru's urban energy network. The project, initiated in September 2025, has been fully funded by the Central Government under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to provide a cost-effective energy solution for households. Surya said Bommanahalli and BTM Layout areas have already achieved near-total PNG coverage and that the success of the JP Nagar project will accelerate expansion to other parts of Bengaluru South. He added that the aim is to ensure widespread PNG connectivity by 2029, particularly benefiting senior citizens and homemakers by improving ease of living in multi-storeyed buildings while keeping energy costs affordable. He further said the NDA Government, under Prime Minister Narendra Modi and union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas Hardeep Singh Puri, is steadily expanding access to safe and sustainable piped gas across the country. MLA CK Ramamurthy and GAIL Chief General Manager Sanjay Singh were present at the event.

Explaining the services to be provided, the Minister said, "During these camps, the Health Department will provide free general health check-ups, orthopaedic care, ENT services, eye check-ups, as well as homoeopathic and ayurvedic treatments for senior citizens." She added that the Social Security Department will facilitate on-the-

spot enrolment for social security pensions, issuance of Senior Citizen Cards and ALIMCO (Artificial Limbs



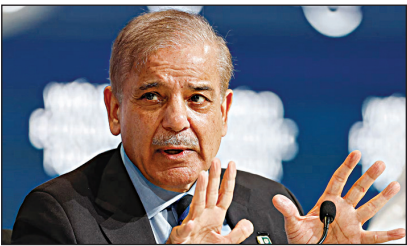
Manufacturing Corporation of India) cards, and provide assistance and information related to the Rashtriya Vayoshri Yojana. The Minister further stated, "The State Legal Services Authority will create awareness among senior citizens about the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, along with other legal rights, so that they feel protected and empowered." She said that with the support of the AYUSH Department and the Department of Youth Affairs, yoga sessions and street plays will also be organised to promote health awareness, strengthen inter-generational bonding and reinforce the spirit of social security.

Highlighting the focus on the special needs of the elderly, Dr Baljit Kaur said, "Essential assistive devices such as near-vision spectacles, hearing aids, walking aids, cervical collars, belts and wheelchairs will be distributed on the spot during the camps." She emphasised that the campaign goes beyond service delivery, adding, "This initiative is about making our senior citizens feel that they are not merely beneficiaries, but the most valuable treasure and guiding force of our society." Referring to the success of similar efforts in the past, the Minister said, "In previous years, thousands of senior citizens have directly benefited from these camps, which clearly reflects the effectiveness of this initiative." She also informed that a toll-free helpline

number 14567 is operational to assist senior citizens. Taking into account the prevailing winter conditions, Minister Dr Kaur said, "While the campaign will commence on January 16, the next phase of health camps in other districts will be rolled out systematically after January 26, keeping the safety and well-being of senior citizens in mind while ensuring quality service delivery." Appealing to senior citizens and their family members, the Cabinet Minister urged, "I appeal to all senior citizens and their families to participate in large numbers in the district-level camps starting January 16 and avail maximum benefit of the free health, legal and welfare services being provided by the Punjab Government."

Pakistan aware high taxation drove out firms, govt pushing ahead with structural reforms, says Finance Minister

Pakistani Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb on Wednesday acknowledged that the govt is aware that a number of companies have either shut down, or otherwise halted operations in the country because of high taxation and expensive energy, and insisted that the government is pushing ahead with much needed structural reforms in order to mitigate the mounting tensions plaguing various businesses in the country. Speaking at the Pakistan Policy Dialogue in Islamabad, Aurangzeb said some departures were unavoidable, given the dilapidated economic situation. "There are firms which are also leaving, that is true," he said. "If the taxation is high or the energy cost is high, or the financing cost is always moving in the wrong direction, those have been real issues." However, he also noted that 20 new foreign investors, including Google, Aramco, Wafi Energy, Turkish Petroleum, and others had entered the Pakistani market in the last 18 months. The finance minister argued that the survival or exit of multinational firms often depended on how successfully they adapted their business models. Some companies, he said, had shifted to local sourcing, stabilised margins and even begun exporting from Pakistan, stating "Because of that their margins are fine, they are now able to export, therefore they stay." Others that failed to adapt, he added, needed to "think through" their approach. Aurangzeb said structural reforms were under way across the economy, with particular emphasis being placed on the overhauling of the Federal Board of Revenue. He stressed that while tax policy now sits with the Ministry of Finance, the FBR's core responsibility is revenue collection. "Compliance and enforcement are essential to ensure implementation of tax laws," he said. Turning to state-owned enterprises, Aurangzeb said inefficiencies were costing the country nearly PKR1 trillion (about \$3.6 billion) a year. "According to a report, we are losing close to a trillion rupees every single year, and we can put it to much better use," he said. As part of cost-cutting and reform efforts, he said several entities, including Utility Stores, the Pakistan Public Works Department and PASCO, had been shut down due to what he described as corruption in subsidy schemes. He added that 24 organisations had been handed over to the Privatisation Commission, noting that the privatisation process for Pakistan International Airlines had attracted interest from local investors. Regarding the outstanding public debt, Aurangzeb said interest payments remained the single largest expenditure item, but recent steps were beginning to yield savings. A newly established Debt Management Office, he said, has helped the country save PKR\$5 billion (\$300 million) in interest payments last year, with similar savings expected in the current fiscal year.

AL exclusion won't allow free and fair elections in Bangladesh: UK MPs warn

London/Dhaka, Jan 14 (Representative)

Highlighting the ban on Bangladesh's largest party Awami League, four MPs in the UK have raised serious concerns over the upcoming February 12 elections, warning that without the inclusion of all major players, the polls cannot be considered as democratic. The document, issued under the banner of the House of Commons, bearing the names of UK MPs Bob Blackman, Jim Shannon, Jas Athwal, and Chris Law, warns that the deregistration and prohibition of such a major player in the Bangladeshi political field automatically sidelines the voices of millions of voters,

undermining public confidence in the electoral process. While the statement does not constitute official UK government policy, it nonetheless reflects growing unease in London regarding Bangladesh's democratic environment, especially in its current volatile landscape. In their joint statement, the UK MPs said that without inclusive participation and impartial international observers, the polls risk disenfranchising large segments of the population. At the centre of their concern is the interim government of Chief Advisor Muhammad Yunus, as the MPs noted that no unelected administration had the power to impose restrictions on political parties – especially those with mass following – as it undermines

the very foundation of the principles concerning democratic governance. The statement from the MPs further



noted that elections held without the participation of all major political forces can't be considered either free or fair, and cautioned that the

decision to ban the Awami League had curtailed political pluralism, effectively disenfranchising millions of Bangladeshi citizens, generating voter apathy and eroding public confidence in the electoral process. Beyond electoral mechanics, the MPs noted various "credible reports" highlighting the ongoing trend of mass detentions and arbitrary arrests of journalists and media workers due to political motivations. Underscoring structural weaknesses within the political and judicial system, these developments raise serious questions about civil liberties and the rule of law during the interim period. The statement comes amid London's own long-standing financial ties with Dhaka, which has

viewed Bangladesh as an important trade partner and thus consistently emphasised democratic stability as a cornerstone of sustainable economic growth and international cooperation. The statement underscores this relationship, framing the current situation not as a partisan issue, but as a matter of regional stability and democratic norms. Importantly, the MPs stopped short of endorsing any specific Bangladeshi political party, and directed their appeal towards the political process itself, while urging both the British government and international bodies such as the United Nations to continue pressing the interim administration to fulfil its democratic commitments, protect civil rights, and ensure the upcoming

election is inclusive and internationally credible. The broader implication of the statement lies in its timing, as the upcoming February 2026 polls have been subject to increasing global scrutiny. Noting Bangladesh's history as one fraught with political tensions, the MPs noted that national reconciliation and economic recovery depend on governance rooted in the genuine consent of the people. Political stability, they argued, cannot be imposed – it must be earned through transparent, participatory processes. While the statement remains a political expression rather than a formal diplomatic action, it reflects a growing international chorus calling for restraint, inclusivity, and adherence to democratic principles.

US Senators introduce Bill to stop Trump seizing Greenland

Washington, Jan 14 (Representative)

US Senators have introduced a Bill aimed at preventing President Donald Trump from taking any action to invade a NATO member or territory, including Greenland. The bipartisan NATO Unity Protection Act, introduced on Tuesday, would bar the Department of Defense and the Department of State from using funds to "blockade, occupy, annex or otherwise assert control" over the territory of any NATO member state. Moreover, Don Bacon of the Republican Party joined House Democrats to introduce legislation seeking to preemptively block the President from using military force to acquire Greenland. "The No Funds for NATO Invasion Act, introduced

Monday, would prohibit the use of federal funds for an invasion of any NATO member state or NATO-protected territory," they wrote in a statement. The members touted the 80-year NATO alliance as "the foundation for peace and cooperation between the United States and our European allies," saying it has led to greater economic opportunity, enhanced safety and more peace with allies. "We must cease the inflammatory rhetoric, work together to take advantage of our shared opportunities, and, most importantly, to counter the real threats from those who do not share our values," they said in the statement. Earlier this evening I introduced the bipartisan No Funds

for NATO Invasion Act, prohibiting the Trump administration from invading the territories of any NATO



ally. NATO has been the foundation for peace between the US and Europe for almost 80 years, and it has made Americans safer and strengthened our defense against those who wish us harm. I appreciate my colleagues' support as we move this legislation

forward," Bill Keating wrote on X. "This is about our fundamental goals and our fundamental security, not just in Europe, but in the United States itself," said Rep. Bill Keating (D-Mass.), who is leading the legislation along with retiring centrist Rep. Don Bacon (R-Neb.), Rep. Steny Hoyer (D-Md.), and Rep. Brendan Boyle (D-Pa.). Keating said lawmakers began rounding up support for the legislation on Monday night and hope more Republicans will join the effort. Keating said he believes targeting funding is a more effective way to pressure the administration. "War powers are important, but we've seen with Democratic and Republican presidents that that's not as effective,"

he said. "It's hard to get around having no funds or not allowing personnel to do it." The new legislation comes as Democrats on Capitol Hill search for ways to constrain further military action by the Trump administration following the ousting of Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro. The Senate could clear a war powers measure on Venezuela later this week, though it faces an uncertain future in the House. Trump administration officials are openly weighing options, including military force, to take control of Greenland, a Danish territory. Such an action would violate NATO's Article V, which states that an attack on one member is an attack on all. Keating told lawmakers that "this legislation takes a clear stand against such action and further supports NATO allies and partners," Politico reported.

Iranian authorities developing new project to fully control nationwide internet flow

Tehran, Jan 14 (Reporter)

Iranian authorities are rapidly proceeding with launching a new comms project, engineered specifically to impose a total internet blackout on the country for as long as it deems fit, in a bid to fully control information flow and establish an iron chokehold on all essential services, as some parts of the country are still able to get internet service, while others are using patchy net services via accessing Starlink satellites. According to Iran International, the project aims to build a nationwide communications network on a Huawei-based platform, doing work similar to services provided by Iranian cloud firm ArvanCloud (Abr Arvan) but on a far larger scale, and intended to host widely used public services as well as banking and payment platforms and other critical infrastructure. The full extent of Huawei's role, or the specifics are largely under wraps, as the Chinese electronics giant refused to comment on the matter. According to the information received, the project is in its final stages and is being brought online under ArvanCloud's management, through a company called Ayandeh Afzay-e Karaneh. The project is linked to individuals, and state entities who have been targeted by US sanctions, including Fanap and its CEO Shahab Javanmardi – sanctioned by the US Treasury in August over alleged ties to Iran's intelligence

ministry and the country's notorious IRGC paramilitary force. As per sources, Huawei has stealthily supplied the required materials and equipment, largely hiding its presence in order to avoid having its name appear on any related documentation of the project, to prevent global scrutiny. President Masoud Pezeshkian visited the construction site of the project in March 2025, which were also visited by China's ambassador. Sources said the project is estimated to cost between \$700 million and \$1 billion, and that all



equipment – supplied by Huawei in China – entered Iran after the 12-day war, shipped in 24 containers. The established data center would have capacity for about 400 server racks and would incorporate ArvanCloud technologies, with much of the country's core digital infrastructure eventually moved to the national cloud service provider. Reportedly, the facility is located beneath Fanap's administrative building in Pardis IT Town, about 20 km northeast of Tehran, in a place designed specifically to avoid missile strike damages.

The nationwide internet and phone disruptions in the meanwhile are continuing as the protests wage on, severely restricting the flow of information, especially regarding the dire human rights situation on the ground right now as the state crackdown shows no signs of halting or mitigating. UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Volker Türk said he was deeply disturbed by reports of violence during nationwide protests and expressed concern about internet and communications shutdowns, calling on authorities to restore access. NetBlocks said on Wednesday

Iran plans to create closed National Internet Network

Iran, Jan 14 (Agency) Iran plans to create a closed internal internet network, where only a limited set of domestic websites will be accessible, The Guardian newspaper reported, citing Iranian digital rights expert Amir Rashidi. On January 8, the NetBlocks internet monitoring service said that Iran had experienced its first nationwide internet blackout since the start of the current protests. The report read on Monday that the IIRIB state broadcasting company had previously published a list of websites that would be accessible in Iran, including domestic search engines, navigation services, messaging apps and even a proprietary streaming service similar to the US's Netflix. All these sites are part of Iran's effort to create a national internet service, Rashidi said. This "skeleton" version of the web is significantly more restricted than even China's, is government-controlled and largely cut off from the outside world, the expert added. Protests erupted in Iran in late December 2025 amid concerns about rising inflation triggered by the weakening of the local currency, the Iranian rial. Since January 8, following calls from Reza Pahlavi, the son of the Shah of Iran, who was overthrown in 1979, protest marches have intensified in Iran. On the same day, internet access was blocked in the country. In several Iranian cities, protests turned into clashes with police as demonstrators shouted slogans critical of the government. There have been reports of casualties among security forces and protesters.

Important task is to fight against online scams: Cambodian PM

Phnom Penh, Jan. 14 (Bureau)

Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet has said that the fight against cyber scams was one of the government's key tasks at present. Hun Manet said maintaining security and social order and combating crime were among the government's prioritized tasks to ensure the peaceful living of citizens. "And the fight against online scams is a key task at this time in addition to other national prioritized tasks," he said in a message posted on his official social media platforms late Tuesday. He said that given the danger to society posed by cybercrime and the complexity of this technology-based crime, which has interconnected networks from one country to another, the government has taken a number of measures against this crime and achieved many positive results. He said the strict measures against online scams in the past were a testament to the government's political commitment to combat this transnational crime, which is a common concern for Cambodia, the region, and the world. Hun Manet called on authorities at all levels and people from all walks of life to join together to eradicate online scams in order to restore Cambodia's image on the international stage.



Indonesia stresses preparedness, vigilance, realism in diplomacy amid fragile global order

Jakarta, Jan 14 (Agency)



Indonesian Foreign Minister Sugiono said on Wednesday that Indonesia's diplomacy must be built on preparedness, vigilance, and realism, as the current global order grows increasingly fragile and the world enters a dangerous "gray zone" marked by sharper competition, deeper fragmentation, and blurred boundaries between peace and conflict. Speaking at the 2026 annual press briefing at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Jakarta, Sugiono said narrow national interests are overriding collective security, while international law, long regarded as a cornerstone of global stability, is being misused and frequently violated without consequences. "When jointly agreed rules are broken without accountability, what collapses is not only a single rule, but trust in the entire order itself," he said. Sugiono noted that global governance mechanisms established to manage crises are struggling to keep pace with rapidly changing geopolitical realities. He added that several key countries have withdrawn from their global responsibilities, further weakening international cooperation. According to him, the global landscape is moving toward sharper competition and deeper fragmentation, characterized by economic interdependence and the growing influence of non-state actors. Against this backdrop, Sugiono stressed that countries lacking clear strategies risk being swept along by global turbulence. Indonesia, he said, must not fall into that category. "We must see the world as it is, harsh, competitive, and increasingly unpredictable," he said, adding that Indonesia's diplomacy must be grounded in preparedness, vigilance, and realism to safeguard national interests and resilience.

Mitchell’s unbeaten 131 powers NZ to series-levelling win

Rajkot, Jan 14 (FN Representative)

A commanding unbeaten century by Daryl Mitchell overshadowed a fighting batting effort from India as New Zealand produced a clinical chase to register a seven-wicket victory and level the series in the second One-Day International of the New Zealand tour of India at the Niranjan Shah Stadium here on Wednesday. Chasing 285, New Zealand were steered home by Mitchell’s masterful unbeaten 131, but the foundation of the contest was laid earlier by India’s recovery to 284 for seven after early and middle-order setbacks. Asked to bat after losing the toss, India began cautiously before Rohit Sharma fell for 24, edging Kristian Clarke to Will Young. Skipper Shubman Gill looked fluent during his 56 off 53 balls, striking nine fours and a six, but his dismissal to Kyle Jamieson triggered a wobble. India soon slid from 99 for one to 118 for four as Virat Kohli (23) was bowled

and Shreyas Iyer (8) edged behind, both falling to Clarke, who emerged as New Zealand’s most incisive bowler in the middle overs. With India in trouble, KL Rahul produced a mature and composed innings to hold the lower order together. The wicketkeeper-batsman absorbed



pressure during a prolonged boundary drought, rotated the strike smartly and reached his half-century with a thick edge past third man. As the innings progressed, Rahul expanded his range with crisp drives through extra cover, confident sweeps and assured footwork against the spinners. Rahul found support in Ravindra Jadeja, who contributed 27, before Nitish Kumar Reddy added late momentum with a brisk 20. In the 49th over, Rahul brought up his eighth ODI hundred in style, launching a full toss from Kyle Jamieson over long-on

for six. He finished unbeaten on 112 off 92 balls, striking 11 fours and a six, as India added 93 runs in the final 12 overs to post 284 for seven. New Zealand’s reply was anchored by Mitchell after early wickets left the visitors at 46 for two. Alongside Will Young, who made a solid 87, Mitchell stitched together a decisive 162-run partnership for the third wicket that effectively took the game away from India. After Young fell to Kuldeep Yadav, Mitchell remained in complete control. Mitchell went on to register a superb unbeaten 131 off 117 balls, striking 11 fours and two sixes, while Glenn Phillips provided finishing support with an unbeaten 32 off 25 balls. New Zealand crossed the target in 47.3 overs, finishing on 286 for three to seal a seven-wicket win and square the series. For India, Kuldeep Yadav, Harshit Rana and Prasidh Krishna picked up a wicket each, but the bowlers struggled to contain Mitchell once he was set. A clinical chase from New Zealand ensured the series was levelled, with Mitchell’s innings standing out as the defining performance of the match.

India held to a draw by Bangladesh in SAFF Futsal Championship

Nonthaburi (Thailand), Jan 14 (Agency)

The Indian men’s team were held to a pulsating 4-4 draw by Bangladesh in their opening match of the SAFF Futsal Championship 2026 at the Nonthaburi Stadium here on Wednesday. K Roluahpuia scored a brace for the Futsal Tigers in the 27th and 36th minutes after Anmol Adhikari (12’) and Lalsawmpuia (20’) scored in the first period. For Bangladesh, Md Moin Ahmed (9’, 31’) and Md Rahbar Wahed Khan (16’, 37’) netted a brace each. India began on the front foot, pressing high and moving the ball quickly across the court. Early chances fell to Anmol Adhikari and Tijo Job, but Bangladesh survived the initial pressure through disciplined defending and sharp counter-attacks. The breakthrough came in the ninth minute when Md Moin Ahmed skipped past Seاون Dsouza on the left and finished from a tight angle to put Bangladesh ahead. India responded swiftly. In the 12th minute, Hafis AM wriggled free under pressure and slipped a precise pass to Adhikari, who kept his composure to fire in the equaliser. The game remained open and intense, with

chances at both ends. Bangladesh regained the lead in the 16th minute after a slick passing move between Moin Ahmed and captain Md Rahbar



Wahed Khan, the latter finishing with the Indian goalkeeper out of position. Just before the interval, India found parity once more. Lalsawmpuia’s effort from a distance in the 20th minute took a heavy deflection off Md Tuhin and wrong-footed the goalkeeper, sending the teams into the break level at 2-2. The second period began with renewed energy from India, who took the lead for the first time in the match in the 27th minute. Lalrinzuala created the opening with clever footwork before laying the ball off to K Roluahpuia, who made no mistake with his finish. Bangladesh pushed back strongly and were rewarded in the 30th minute when Moin Ahmed struck again from

a narrow angle, the ball slipping under the goalkeeper to complete his brace. India refused to retreat and struck again in the 36th minute with a well-worked move involving Roluahpuia and Tijo Job. After exchanging passes, Roluahpuia forced his way through tight marking and finished calmly to restore India’s lead at 4-3. However, the advantage was short-lived. Adhikari failed to control a loose ball and gifted possession to Rahbar Wahed Khan, who unleashed a powerful right-footed shot in the 37th minute to draw Bangladesh level once more. The closing moments were frantic. India went close to snatching a winner when Jonathan Lalrawngbawla failed to convert a rebound from close range after a sharp save from the Bangladesh goalkeeper. The final whistle confirmed a high-quality 4-4 draw, leaving India with both positives and regrets as the tournament got underway. Danish shuttler Antonsen withdraws from India Open citing air pollution

New Delhi, Jan 14 (Representative) Danish shuttler Anders Antonsen, the men’s singles world No. 3, said on Wednesday he has withdrawn from the ongoing India Open, citing "extreme" air pollution here. The four-time World Championships medalist said the conditions in the Indian capital prompted his decision to pull out of the tournament for the third consecutive year. "Many is curious why I have pulled out of the India Open for the third consecutive year. Due to the extreme pollution in Delhi at the moment, I don't think it's a place to host a badminton tournament," Antonsen wrote on his social media platform. As per the BWF world rankings for January 2026, Antonsen is ranked No. 3 in the men’s singles. He has previously been ranked world No. 2. On Tuesday, another Danish player Mia Blichfeldt described the environment in New Delhi as unhealthy. According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), the overall AQI of Delhi was recorded at 353 on Wednesday at 4:00 p.m. local time. Air pollution in Delhi typically worsens during the winter months. Industrial activity, vehicle traffic and construction are major contributors.

Bellingham denies links to Alonso's Real Madrid departure

Madrid, Jan 14 (FN Representative) Real Madrid midfielder Jude Bellingham has rejected reports that he played a role in the departure of coach Xabi Alonso. Alonso left Real Madrid "by mutual" consent on Monday following Sunday's defeat to FC Barcelona in the Spanish Super Cup final, with Spanish media reports also pointing to a difficult relationship with Vinicius Jr. and Bellingham. Neither Bellingham nor Vinicius posted a public farewell message on social media in the hours after the news broke, but Bellingham responded to the reports with a message criticizing the rumors and those who spread them. "Until now, I have let too many things slide, hoping that the truth will come to light in its own time," wrote Bellingham on his JB5 application. "Truly feel sorry for the people who hang onto every word of these 'clowns' and their sources. Do not believe everything you read, every now and then, these lot need to be held accountable for spreading this kind of damaging misinformation for clicks and added controversy," concluded Bellingham. Alvaro Arbeloa is set to make his debut as Alonso's replacement on Wednesday night in the Copa del Rey fourth round away to Albacete.

Top seed Shelton books Auckland quarterfinal spot at ASB Classic

Auckland, Jan 14 (Reporter) Top seed Ben Shelton advanced to the quarterfinals of the ASB Classic on Wednesday here in New Zealand, after battling past Argentina’s Francisco Comesana 7-5, 6-4. Shelton, competing in Auckland for the fourth straight year, saved three set points while trailing 5-4 in the opening set before breaking serve and taking control. The American, ranked eighth in the world, did not face another break point and sealed victory in one hour and 42 minutes. "Tennis is a game of very small margins, and some days that's not going to go my way. Shelton will next face Argentina's Sebastian Baez on Thursday after Baez beat American Jensen Brooksby 7-5, 6-0 in their second-round match. Also on Wednesday, Hungary's Fabian Marozsan upset second seed Casper Ruud of Norway 6-4, 6-4 to reach his 10th ATP Tour quarterfinal. Marozsan is coming off a first-round win over defending champion Gael Monfils of France on Tuesday. Monfils, 39, confirmed he will retire at the end of the year, bidding farewell to Auckland fans after the match.

Amateur stuns world's best to win A\$1m in Melbourne

Melbourne, Jan 14 (Agency) Amateur player Jordan Smith would have been "happy winning just one point" - but walked away with A\$1m and bragging rights over world number two Jannik Sinner as he triumphed at the Australian Open's Million Dollar One Point Slam. According to BBC Sport, the innovative format offered amateur players the opportunity to win the prize money by playing a sole point against some of the sport's top talent and other famous faces. Smith was the star of the show on Rod Laver Arena, also defeating women's world number four Amanda Anisimova in front of 10,000 people. Smith faced women's world number 117 Joanna Garland in a fitting finale, after the Taiwanese 24-year-old stunned men's world number three Alexander Zverev and former Wimbledon finalist Nick Kyrgios. New South Wales state champion Smith was not the only amateur to seize his moment in the spotlight, with Queensland state champion Alec Reverente beating men's world number seven Felix Auger-Aliassime. As the two best performing amateurs, Smith and Reverente also went head-to-head to win a brand new car, with Reverente triumphing. The tournament was played in good spirits - even a racquet smash by Kyrgios following his defeat was performed in good humour - and generated genuine intrigue.

Those defeats left the party weakened in parliament, even as it retained power. Since taking office, however, Takaichi has enjoyed unusually high personal approval. While overall support for the LDP hovers around 35%, cabinet approval ratings linked to the prime minister herself have reached as high as 76% in some polls. Analysts say that this gap is what has encouraged her to consider an early election, betting that voters will respond more to her leadership than to party labels. Her standing as premier has been significantly bolstered by a string of high-profile moments, which include the internationally covered high-profile visit by US President Donald Trump shortly after she was sworn in, as well as her hardline stance on Chinese adventurism over Taiwan and the Senkaku islands. As Takaichi has doubled down on Chinese aggression -- in turn leading to a significant degradation of bilateral relations between Tokyo and Beijing -- her uncompromising stance on national security, and her overall assertive and strong style of leadership has given her position a notable boost in popularity. Iran vows retaliation as...

Brig Gen Aziz Nasirzadeh, said at a security meeting, according to Iran’s state-run Press TV. The response came after Trump posted on social media on Tuesday that help for Iranian protesters was “on its way,” a message that fuelled speculation about imminent American action and drew sharp condemnation from Tehran. Any response, Nasirzadeh added, “would be painful” for Iran’s enemies. He also cautioned that countries assisting an attack on Iran would be considered “legitimate targets.” According to rights groups and media reports, more than 2,500 people may have been killed in clashes between security forces and demonstrators, though Iranian authorities have not released comprehensive casualty figures. What started as protests over inflation and unemployment has evolved into a broader challenge to Iran’s clerical establishment, which has ruled since the 1979 Islamic Revolution. Iran’s leadership has also sought to project strength after last summer’s brief but intense conflict with Israel. Nasirzadeh said damage from Israel’s 12-day war on Iran in June had been repaired and that the country’s military production capacity had increased. The rising instability has prompted concern well beyond the region. On Wednesday, India advised its citizens to leave Iran “as soon as possible,” citing a rapidly deteriorating security situation. In a statement, the Indian Embassy in Tehran urged students, pilgrims, business-people and tourists to depart using any available means, including commercial flights. The Ministry of External Affairs also renewed its warning against travel to Iran and said embassy helplines had been activated to assist citizens. Those who remain were urged to stay vigilant, avoid protest areas and register with diplomatic authorities. UNI AAB JRC

They discussed next steps regarding our bilateral trade negotiations, critical minerals, and a possible meeting next month.” US State Department Principal Deputy Spokesperson Tommy Pigott said, “Secretary Rubio spoke today with Indian External Affairs Minister Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, exchanging best wishes for the New Year.” A day earlier, Gor announced that India will be invited to join Pax Silica, a US-led strategic initiative aimed at securing critical supply chains spanning silicon, advanced manufacturing, and artificial intelligence. Gor, who recently arrived in New Delhi, emphasised continued engagement between the two sides. “Real friends can disagree but always resolve their differences,” he said, adding that “both sides continue to be actively engaged.” Gor said, “We are determined to get a trade deal,” and indicated that talks would continue without pause. “The next round of calls on trade will happen tomorrow.” In a significant strategic signal, Gor highlighted India’s inclusion in Pax Silica, describing it as a key US-led initiative spanning the entire high-technology ecosystem: “Pax Silica is a US-led strategic initiative, from critical minerals to advanced manufacturing.”

Startup Yuva Festival 2026 is organised to take student-led startups from campus to market, the festival aims to convert innovations developed within educational institutions into commercially viable and sustainable enterprises. Under the ‘Campus to Market’ initiative, students presented their ideas to investors, mentors and industry experts. The programme also featured knowledge sessions, policy discussions and an award ceremony. Out of more than 700 applications, over 60 startups participated in the Startup Expo, with the top 20 selected for live pitching. The top six startups received grants of Rs. 10 lakh each, while the top 100 startups were awarded grants of Rs.1 lakh each.

PM Modi to inaugurate 28th Commonwealth Speakers’ Conference

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the 28th Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers of the Commonwealth (CSPOC) on Thursday, underscoring India’s growing role as a key convener of global democratic dialogue. The Prime Minister will also address the international gathering of parliamentary leaders at the opening session scheduled for 10:30 am at the Central Hall of Samvidhan Sadan in the Parliament House Complex. The high-level conference will be chaired by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and will bring together 61 Speakers and Presiding Officers from 42 Commonwealth countries, along with representatives from four semi-autonomous parliaments, reflecting the breadth and diversity of the Commonwealth parliamentary community. Officials said the conference will focus on strengthening democratic institutions at a time when legislatures across the world are grappling with rapid technological change and evolving public expectations. “The CSPOC provides a vital platform for parliamentary leaders to exchange best practices and collectively reflect on how legislatures can remain robust, transparent and responsive,” a senior official said. A key area of discussion will be the role of Speakers and Presiding Officers in upholding the dignity and effectiveness of legislatures while ensuring smooth conduct of proceedings and protection of members’ rights. The agenda also includes deliberations on the use of artificial intelligence in parliamentary functioning, ranging from legislative research and documentation to improving efficiency and accessibility. Participants will further examine the impact of social media on Members of Parliament, including its influence on public discourse, accountability and parliamentary privilege. Innovative strategies to enhance public understanding of Parliament and deepen citizen participation beyond the act of voting are also expected to be a major focus. The CSPOC is a long-standing forum of the Commonwealth that convenes periodically to promote parliamentary democracy, good governance and cooperation among member countries. India’s hosting of the 28th edition comes at a time when it is seeking to position itself as a bridge between established and emerging democracies within the Commonwealth. Prime Minister Modi has consistently emphasised the importance of strong legislatures and inclusive governance, and his address is expected to highlight India’s democratic traditions as well as the need for parliaments to adapt to technological and societal changes while remaining anchored in constitutional values. The conference proceedings are expected to culminate in shared recommendations aimed at reinforcing the relevance and resilience of parliamentary institutions across the Commonwealth in the years ahead.

Kalayatra 2026 begins five-day celebration of Indian classical dance

Only Hindu festivals face such halts: Poonawala slams Kerala govt

BJP’s national spokesperson Shehzad Poonawala on Wednesday accused the Left government in Kerala of having an “anti-Hindu character” after revenue authorities issued a memo halting the construction of a temporary bridge for the upcoming Maha Magha festival in Thirunavaya. He said the move to stop the bridge work essential for the

festival -- called the Kumbh Mela of the south being restarted after years -- was a deliberate attempt to sabotage the event. Poonawala alleged that such concerns are only raised for Hindu festivals due to vote bank politics, citing past controversies such as the Sabarimala gold and ghee “loot”. The memo was issued for the bridge on the Bharathapuzha river, meant for the festival scheduled from January 18 to February 3 on the sandbed near the Nava Mukunda Temple. Poonawala claimed that both the ruling LDF and opposition UDF exhibit “anti-Hindu sentiment” and mock Hindu beliefs while being silent on issues concerning other faiths.
