New Low Pressure Area forms over Bay, Cauvery delta, south coastal dists of TN to get heavy rains

Chennai, Nov 22 (Agency)



fresh Low Pressure area has formed over Strait of Malacca and adjoining South Andaman Sea today under the influence of yesterday's upper air cyclonic circulation over central parts of Strait of Malacca, which would bring heavy rains in Cauvery delta and south coastal districts of Tamil Nadu till November 25, following an yellow alert was issued. Met office today said it is very likely to move west-northwestwards and concentrate into a Depression over Southeast Bay of Bengal around November 24. It would continue to move west-northwestwards and is very likely to intensify further over southwest Bay of Bengal during the subsequent 48 hours. An upper air cyclonic circulation lies over Comorin area and adjoining Indian Equatorial Ocean and extends upto 1.5 km above mean sea level, while yesterday's cyclonic circulation over Southeast Arabian Sea extending upto 3.1 km above mean sea level persists. Met office said light to moderate rain is likely to occur at a few places over Tamil Nadu, and over Puducherry and Karaikal area with thunderstorm and lightning at one or two places. It has forecast heavy rain in 15 districts of the State. Heavy rain is likely to occur at isolated places over Kanyakumari, Tirunelveli, Tenkasi, Thoothukudi, Ramanathapuram, Virudhunagar, Madurai, Sivaganga, Pudukkottai, Thanjavur, Tiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Mayiladuthurai, Cuddalore, Ariyalur, Kallakurichi districts and Puducherry ▶ Cont. to Page-7

New UP BJP president soon, Yogi ministry expansion too on cards

Lucknow, Nov 22 (FN Bureau)

¬ollowing the resounding **◄** victory of NDA in the Bihar assembly elections, buzz has once again intensified within the Uttar Pradesh Bharatiya Janata Party regarding a new state president and a possible ministry expansion of the Yogi Adityanath government. According to BJP sources told UNI here on Saturday that the central leadership is

expected to announce the name of the state president soon, following the party's impressive success in the Bihar Assembly elections. Sources said that following the formation of the BJP-led NDA government in Bihar with a landslide majority, a phase of major organizational changes will now begin in Uttar Pradesh. The BJP high command is expected to appoint a new state president by December, along with the second expansion of the Yogi 2.0

cabinet. Another senior BJP official savs that the BJP has been awaiting



a new state president in Uttar Pradesh for the past 11 months.

The appointment has been stalled due to by-elections in Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh, and the recent Bihar elections. He explained that the central leadership had postponed the decision to make changes in Uttar Pradesh until after the Bihar election results. Now, the high command will make the necessary changes to the government and organization by December without further delay. Sources indicate that among the names being considered for the new state president, Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya, Cabinet Minister and former state president Swatantradev Singh, and Dharampal Singh are being considered. Deputy Chief Minister Brajesh Pathak is also in the running as a Brahmin candidate. However, given the upcoming elections, the organization is more likely ▶ Cont. to Page-7

■ New deep-sea 'Octopus Squid' discovered in Arabian Sea

Kochi, Nov 22 (Agency) Scientists at the ICAR-Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) have identified a new species of deep-sea squid from the Arabian Sea—only the second confirmed species belonging to the globally rare genus Taningia. The newly discovered species has been named Taningia silasii (Indian octopus squid) and formally described in the international journal Marine Biodiversity. Collected from a depth of nearly 390 metres off the Kollam coast, the specimen measures 45 cm in dorsal mantle length. It belongs to the family Octopoteuthidae, a group of deep-sea squids notable for lacking the characteristic long tentacles present in most other squid species. The discovery was made by a CMFRI team led by Principal Scientist Dr. Geetha Sasikumar and Technical Officer ▶ Cont. to Page-7

■ BlueBird 6, heaviest satellite for LEO, to be launched aboard LVM3 on Dec 15

Chennai, Nov 22 (Agency) Nasdaq-listed cellular broadband company AST SpaceMobile Inc. today announced that its BlueBird 6 satellite will lift off on December 15, 2025, from India aboard the ISRO's heavy-lift LVM3 rocket. At 6,500 kg, BlueBird 6 will be the heaviest satellite ever placed into Low Earth Orbit (LEO) by the LVM3, which currently boasts a 100% launch success rate. BlueBird 6 marks the debut of AST SpaceMobile's next-generation satellite fleet. Once deployed, it will feature the largest commercial phased array in LEO, spanning nearly 2,400 sq ft—a 3.5× increase over its predecessors, BlueBirds 1–5—and delivering 10× more data capacity, the company said. AST SpaceMobile is developing what it calls the world's first and only spacebased cellular broadband network designed to connect directly to everyday ▶ Cont. to Page-7

nion Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday asserted that preventing infiltration into the country is very important, not only from the security point of view, but for protecting democracy, and added that no infiltrator has the right to influence the democratic system. Shah was speaking at Border Security Force's diamond jubilee celebrations in Bhuj, Gujarat, and made it clear that only Indian citizens will decide who the Chief Minister of any

state becomes, or who becomes the Prime Minister of the nation. He said that the BSF remains fully engaged in preventing infiltration along the borders, adding that preventing infiltration is essential for protecting the democratic system from being polluted. He declared with firm resolve that every infiltrator will be identified and be deported one-by-one. The HM said that the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) is also an important step to help protect the democracy from infiltrators and to make it even stronger. Shah expressed that it was unfortunate that some political parties are

trying to weaken the efforts to drive out infiltrators. Shah has appealed to the people of

the country to extend their support



to the process, and added that the mandate given by the people in the Bihar polls is a clear message that the citizens of the country will not

accept infiltrators at any cost. Shah said that during the past few years, border fencing has been strengthened rapidly, and has been made impenetrable. Indian Railways crosses 1 billion tonne freight loading in FY26



New Delhi (Agency): Indian Railways freight performance continues to strengthen India's economic backbone, with cumulative loading this year crossing the 1-billion-tonne mark -- reaching 1020 million tonnes (MT), the Ministry of Railways said on Saturday. This milestone reflects broad-based support from key sectors. Coal remained the largest contributor at 505 MT, followed by iron ore (115 MT), cement (92 MT), container traffic (59 MT), pig iron & finished steel (47 MT), fertilisers (42 MT), mineral oil (32 MT), foodgrains (30 MT), raw materials for steel plants (approx. 20 MT), and balance-othergoods (74 MT), as of November 19. Daily loading continues to hold strong at around 4.4 MT, higher than 4.2 MT last year, demonstrating improved operational efficiency and sustained demand, the ministry informed. Freight loading between April to October further underscores this positive trajectory, touching 935.1 MT in 2025, compared to 906.9 MT during the same period last year, marking a healthy year-on-year growth. "This sustained momentum, combined with improved daily loading rates, demonstrates Railways' capacity to support India's industrial expansion and infrastructure development," the ministry said in a statement. Recognising the critical role of cement in India's infrastructure growth, Railways has taken significant steps to optimise this segment's logistics capabilities. The recent rollout of comprehensive reforms, including the Policy for Bulk Cement Terminals and rationalised rates for bulk cement movement in containers, represents a strategic initiative to modernise cement transportation. According to the statement, these measures aim to increase bulk handling capacity, reduce transit time, and lower logistics costs, directly benefiting both industry players and end consumers while driving greater efficiency across the supply chain. Such targeted interventions catalyse sectoral transformation. Shifting bulk goods movement to rail yields multiple benefits that extend beyond mere commercial metrics. It reduces carbon footprints, decongest highways, and provides industries, including MSMEs, access to greener logistics solutions. These developments reinforce India's commitment to sustainable growth, aligning freight operations with the nation's journey towards Net Zero Carbon Emission targets and positioning Railways as a catalyst for both economic and environmental progress, the Ministry noted.

New labour codes to boost formalisation, gender parity of India's workforce: Industry leaders

New Delhi (Agency): India's top industry bodies and staffing leaders on Saturday labelled the implementation of the Four Labour Codes a landmark step toward the workforce, expanding social security, and aligning India's labour framework with global standards. The India Electronics & Semiconductor Association (IESA) said the reforms would significantly benefit the hightechnology sectors by enhancing workforce stability, improving safety standards, and enabling labour flexibility with social protection. "Mandatory appointment letters, universal minimum wages, and pan-India social security coverage (including ESIC expansion) ensure greater formalisation. strengthens worker confidence -critical skill-intensive manufacturing such as fabs, ATMP, component manufacturing and design centres," said Ashok Chandak, President, IESA and SEMI India. Provisions for fixed-term employment, faster dispute resolution, single licensing, and



simplified compliance directly support the scaling of high-tech manufacturing clusters, statement said. Meanwhile, parity of benefits for Fixed-Term Employees (FTE) and expanded social security protections ensure a balanced, worker-centric ecosystem, he added. Sachin Alug, CEO of NLB Services, a technology and digital talent provider, said the reforms were long

overdue for India's gig economy and will offer protection to a fastgrowing but previously unorganised workforce. The new laws are also expected to promote gender parity in the workforce by opening doors to wider opportunities across diverse sectors. Additionally, other groups such as" He also pointed out that new laws will promote gender parity and contract workers, youth

workers, and fixed-term employees will benefit from clearer workinghour norms, expanded social minimum protections, and health benefits. "By simplifying compliance and unifying the regulatory framework, the codes can significantly expand formal employment, bringing millions of workers, especially in industries that rely on contract, temporary, and project-based roles, into the fold of structured, protected work," said Balasubramanian A, Senior Vice President, TeamLease Services. "National floor minimum wage creates a consistent benchmark across states and is an important step in India's evolution from a minimum-wage economy to a livingwage economy," he noted. Suchita Dutta, Executive Director of Indian Staffing Federation (ISF), said the codes simplify compliance for employers, reduce regulatory burdens, and foster a more flexible hiring environment -- crucial for the staffing industry, which has long advocated for such changes to unlock formal job creation.

US court orders Byju Raveendran to pay over USD 1 billion, firm to appeal



New Delhi (Agency): A US bankruptcy court has ordered Byju's founder Byju Raveendran to pay over USD 1.07 billion, holding him personally liable for the movement and concealment of funds from Byju's Alpha, the company's US-based financing arm. The default judgment, issued by Judge Brendan

Shannon of the Delaware Bankruptcy Court, follows Raveendran's repeated failure to comply with directions to appear before the court and provide documents, according to multiple media reports. A default judgment is a ruling issued when a party does not participate in the litigation or ignores court orders, allowing the court to decide the case without a trial. Meanwhile, Byju Raveendran denied allegations and informed that he will appeal the US court judgment. Raveendra said that the US Court default judgement was issued on an expedited basis and precluded him from presenting a defence. "The Court, in our view, ignored relevant facts.

Bitcoin heads for worst monthly slump since 2022 as crypto rout deepens

New Delhi (Agency): Bitcoin is sliding toward its steepest monthly decline since the 2022 crypto meltdown, with a sharp downturn inmarket sentiment, large-scale liquidations institutional selling dragging the broader digital asset ecosystem lower. India's trade momentum robust, FY26 CAD to touch nearly 1 pc of GDP: SBI Research



New Delhi (Agency): India's trade momentum remains firm despite global volatility, and the current account is expected to slip into a modest deficit before turning into positive territory, a report said on Saturday. The report from SBI Research forecasts that the current account deficit (CAD) will be about 1.8 per cent and 2.8 per cent of GDP in Q2

and Q3 FY26, respectively, before it will turn into the positive territory in Q4 FY26. It projects a full fiscal?year deficit of roughly 1 - 1.3 per cent and a marginal overall balance?of?payments deficit of up to USD 10 billion for FY26. "Even though balance of payments (BOP) will turn negative in FY26, the alarm bells that are being sounded regarding its impact on rupee movements seems to be a little overblown at this point," the report said. India's total merchandise exports in April to September of FY26 inched up 2.9 per cent to USD 220 billion, with shipments to the US growing 13 per cent to USD 45 billion despite front?loading effects and a decline in the US share of exports since July 2025. SBI Research stated that marine products and RMG cotton witnessed positive growth during September period.

Nifty, Sensex continue rally for second week despite FII outflows



Mumbai (Agency): Indian benchmarks made marginal gains for the second week, supported by stronger second quarter (Q2) earnings, easing inflation and optimism around the India-US trade negotiations. Benchmark indices Nifty and Sensex edged higher 0.68 and 0.50 per cent during the week to close at 26,068 and 85,231, respectively. Analysts said that a moderation in FII selling due to expectations of earnings upgrades in H2 FY26 also supported the rally. However, markets turned volatile on Friday amid weak global cues.

HP intensifies action against illicit liquor, 54,945 lts seized since April



The Excise department has intensified its crackdown on illicit liquor across the state. Special teams are conducting

raids and have registered 523 cases so far during this financial year. The department has seized 21,637.166 liters of illicit liquor and 33,308.900 liters of 'lahan' (raw material or wash used to produce illicit liquor) from various locations across the state. Last month alone, 309.340 liters of illicit liquor and 12 liters of 'lahan' were seized in the southern region of Shimla, 2,678.225 liters of illicit liquor and 14 liters of 'lahan' in the central region of Mandi and 529.150 liters of liquor and 4,870 liters of 'lahan' in the northern

region of Palampur. Additionally, 286.09 liters of illicit liquor were seized in police district Baddi, 2090.625 liters in Kullu, 528.350 liters in Mandi and 286.045 liters in Una. The government has directed district officials to take legal action against those involved in this trade. In October, the department seized large quantities of illicit liquor and several operational distilleries in villages Milwan, Thakurdwara, Barota, Bela

Ludacha and Ulehriyan in the Damtal area of Police District Nurpur which was destroyed on the spot after taking appropriate legal action. In

accordance with the directives

of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, the excise department has formed special departmental teams at the district level to curb the smuggling of illicit liquor. Through these teams, an intensive campaign is being carried out in the state against illegal liquor activities. The department has

constituted 35 special teams to stop illegal liquor activities out of which four teams each have been deployed in Kullu and Chamba districts, three each in Shimla, Solan, Bilaspur, Mandi and Una districts and Nurpur police district, two teams each in Kangra, Sirmaur and

Hamirpur districts and BBN police district and one team in Kinnaur district. Excise Commissioner Yunus said the state government was keeping a close vigil on the illegal activities and taking strict action as per the rules so that the government revenue was not affected by the illegal liquor trade.

G20 Summit: PM Modi calls for new growth model, citing environmental and social costs

Addressing the 1st session of the G20 Leaders' Summit in Johannesburg titled 'Inclusive and Sustainable Economic Growth - Leaving No One Behind', PM Modi highlighted the disproportionate impact of current development models on the developing world, particularly Africa. early a decade after director Razneesh Ghai first heard the haunting tale of courage displayed by Indian soldiers at Rezang La, the story has finally found its voice on the big screen. "120 Bahadur", a visceral retelling of the iconic battle fought by 120 soldiers of the 13 Kumaon Regiment in the unforgiving terrain of Chushul, Ladakh, at an altitude of over 16,000 feet, premiered at the ongoing International Film Festival of India (IFFI). The film carries with it years of inspiration, grit, and an unwavering tribute to valor. In an exclusive with UNI, Ghai revealed that ever since he first heard the story from his brother, Deputy Chief of Army Staff (Strategy) Lt Gen Rajiv Ghai, the former Director General of Military Operations, he felt compelled to bring it to life. "I started working on the film five years ago," he said. Ghai described the film as layered with themes of camaraderie, courage, and the indomitable spirit of Indian soldiers. Reflecting

on his childhood as the son of an Army officer, he recalled growing up during a period when India had lost the war to China.

"When we were army kids, we used to worry about our fathers going to war. That fear stayed with me," he said. Reflecting on his childhood as an Army officer's

son, he recalled growing up in a time when India had lost the war to China. "The reason I wanted to make this film is, when we were growing up as army kids, India had lost the war to China. And we used to be

worried for our fathers," he said. "We used to wonder, if they went to war again, what would happen to them? And that's when, I heard the story and I decided I want to make this film. Ghai added. Speaking about his brother, the former Director General Military Operations who played an instrumental role during Operation Sindoor, Ghai said that the General helped him with a lot of input while making the film. "I'm making this film because of him. He's the one who told me

this story about ten years ago and it stayed in my mind. It's only about five years ago that I started working on this. I've been living with this for a long time. Thanks to him we're making this movie," he said. When asked why

the film does not explicitly credit the character based on then Brigade Commander Brigadier T.N. Raina, portrayed by Ajinkya Deo, Ghai said the team was unable to contact his next of kin to seek permission.

"Without their consent, I didn't want to go ahead with it. But everyone knows who the character represents," he added. Before its global release, 120 Bahadur became embroiled in a legal dispute after the Sanyukt Ahir Regiment Morcha and families of Rezang La soldiers filed a PIL, claiming the film misrepresented the historic battle. On Wednesday, however, the Delhi High Court allowed the release to proceed, noting that last-minute changes to the title or content were not feasible. The court recorded that the film ends with a tribute naming all 120 soldiers and said any further corrections, if needed, could be incorporated in the OTT version. Speaking on the matter, Ghai said they have given due credit to the soldiers who laid down their lives in the battle. "I don't know what the petitioners were complaining about. They should all come to the theatres and watch the film. Then they will see that they've been wasting their time and money on a legal battle," he said. When asked if his next film would be another war movie, possibly based on Operation Sindoor, Ghai laughed and said he would be taking a break. "I'm going to take a break for now. Maybe a horror film will be next," he added.

Generative AI at three Promise, profit, or bubble

We are approaching the third anniversary of ChatGPT's release. When OpenAI launched it, the world was stunned. For the first time, the wider public directly experienced the power of Generative Artificial Intelligence (Gen AI): large language models (LLMs) could generate coherent, context-aware paragraphs from just a few words of instruction.

Three years later, we stand at a crossroads, not only for the global economy but for human civilisation itself. It is now evident that Gen AI is a transformative technology that is reshaping nearly every aspect of our lives, from education to business and beyond.

Gen AI differs from every previous wave of disruptive innovation in several fundamental ways. Its adoption has been astonishingly rapid and global, both in the number of users and in its spread across borders. Nearly 70 per cent of new API users of OpenAI's platforms now come from outside the United States. In the last five decades of American technological dominance, no other innovation has seen such swift and widespread international uptake.

Moreover, with reinforcement learning and continuous model upgrades, LLMs are becoming increasingly adaptive, forming a self-improving loop that enhances their performance over time. While the industrial revolution automated muscle power, Gen AI automates cognition and decision-making. That marks a profound shift, as these were tasks once considered uniquely human. As Prof Diganta Mukherjee of ISI Kolkata observes, "AI is the next big thing after computerisation. The way we replaced repetitive processes at the lower end of the value chain in the early 1990s is now being replicated at a higher level, with AI taking over more complex yet still repetitive tasks such as decision-making.

While no other technology has achieved such widespread adoption, the challenge with AI today lies in the scale of investment it has attracted. The top five AI-focused companies - Apple, Nvidia, Microsoft, Alphabet, and Amazon - now account for nearly one-third of the S&P 500 index. Overall, AI-focused companies have driven roughly 80 per cent of the S&P 500's gains in 2025. Yet, the incremental improvements in successive AI models, particularly LLMs, are becoming less visible to the public. The current challenges facing the AI ecosystem can be broadly grouped into three categories.

One: LLMs have already trained on nearly all publicly available human content, leaving little new data to improve them. Adding AI-generated material offers minimal gains. This saturation exposes ethical issues, especially around fair compensation for creators. In 2023, artists Sarah Andersen, Kelly McKernan, and Karla Ortiz sued AI image companies, claiming their works were used in training without consent or payment. They argue this violates copyright law through unauthorised copying and imitation of their styles, creating "21st-century collage tools". AI firms counter that using public images qualifies as fair use for transformative purposes. The case, still unresolved, will likely set a precedent for how copyright law, written long before AI, applies to systems that learn from creative works at scale. Its outcome could redefine how AI companies source data and how artists protect their work.

The Rise Of 'Educated' Terrorists: Decoding The New Jihadi Architecture

Doctors turning into terrorists is neither new nor surprising. The phenomenon of educated jihadis is now a global pattern. Multiple studies show that nearly 70 per cent of major terror attacks worldwide were planned and executed by technically trained individuals, particularly engineering graduates. Among doctors, the most notorious example is Zakir Naik, who used respectable platforms like television to radicalise Muslims across the subcontinent. Naik obtained his MBBS from Topiwala National Medical College, Ayman Mumbai. Zawahiri, the former Al-Qaeda chief, held a master's degree in surgery from Cairo University.

Mahathir Mohamad, who reshaped Malaysia's Islamic identity, studied at King Edward VII College of Medicine, Singapore. Mahathir has openly articulated his belief in political Islam and consistently returned to rigid interpretations of Islamic scripture. He declared Malaysia "Islamic state", emphasising Islamic solutions to global issues. Zakir Naik has been a permanent resident of Malaysia since 2016. India revoked his passport in 2017 on charges of money laundering and hate speech. While analysing terrorism, we must recognise that every human has both an Intelligence Quotient (IQ) and an Ideological Quotient (IdQ). Among Muslims, Christians, Communists, the ideological quotient tends to overshadow individual reasoning

single-book belief system that often subsumes critical thought. The persistence of groups like the Flat Earth Society, whose members interpret biblical verses as scientific proof that the Earth is flat, illustrates how ideology overrides intellect. Some commercial pilots are members of this society,

because each is rooted in a



showing that professional training does not immunise one against ideological rigidity. At the Middle East Forum, Pakistan's disgraced nuclear scientist Pervez Hoodbhoy was asked why the Islamic world, despite possessing vast resources and a population of over a billion, remains disengaged from scientific progress. He replied, "Seven centuries ago, Islam and science parted ways. The biggest prob-lem is Islamism. Wherever religious fundamentalism dominates, blind faith clouds rational thinking." When asked why so many doctors, engineers, and technologists are drawn to Islamism, and sometimes terrorism, Hoodbhoy stated, "We must separate scientists from technologists. First-rate scientists do not become Islamists. But second- and third-rate technologists are far more susceptible." Thus,

many Muslim technologists are wired one way intellectually but hardwired another way ideologically. Their brains follow technology; their hearts follow the call of jihad. The calling of jihad originates at home, in madrassas, online groups, peer circles, and minority institutions that the Indian Constitution permits, many of which are exploited to create anti-national currents. The doctor module, Muzammil, Ali Ahmad, Umar, and Irfan Waqih, were first ideologically shaped as stone-pelting children in the Kashmir Valley. They later evolved into "doctor-terrorists" during their years at medical college in Srinagar, where the overwhelming Muslim student population creates a closed ideological ecosystem. What distinguishes a radicalised Muslim from a non-radical one is the degree of influence of the Indian/Sanatan civilisational environment. Those who sever their connection with Sanatan roots drift towards radicalisation and eventually jihadism. Islam is an organised, congregational faith designed to forge ideological unity. This organisational rigidity leaves little room for spiritualism.

Highly organised ideological faiths seldom allow genuine spiritualism. Spirituality is linked to nature, its beauty, mystery, and manifestations. In nature there is proof of the divine. One-book faiths negate the idea of heaven on Earth and instead promise a commodified paradise, complete with 72 virgins, a concept that objectifies women and incentivises suicide missions. This leads to a foundational question: If suicide bombing is martyrdom, against whom is this martyrdom directed? Red Fort suicide bomber Umar-ul-Nabi called suicide bombing "martyrdom in Islam" and justified killing 30 innocent people near the Red Fort as justice for Kashmir". Why such grievance when the Kashmir Valley is already Islamicised, transformed from Dar-ul-Harb (land of non-believers) into Dar-ul-Islam? What about the injustice suffered Kashmiri Hindus, driven out in 1990 and still living in exile? Suicide bomber Umar-ul-Nabi was deeply involved in religious conversion at Al-Falah University, where he used his authority as assistant professor to pressure students and staff to convert.



Ayodhya, A City Unlocked, As The Flag Of Dharma Is Set To Fly Atop Ram Mandir

A city with no locks. That is how poet Tulsidas described Shri Ram's Ayodhya in his Ramayana.

Today's Ayodhya has certainly not reached the kind of prosperity and integrity famously attributed to Ram Rajya. But the sheer scale of change that the city has been undergoing since Adityanath took over as chief minister of Uttar Pradesh in 2017, coupled with the Narendra Modi government's developmental push from the Centre, is staggering. It is befitting then that on November 25, PM Modi will hoist the sacred flag atop the 191-foot-high spire of the Ram Temple - rebuilt nearly 500 years after it was destroyed by Mughal emperor Babur's commander Mir Baqi while Yogi oversees preparations for the magnificent event.

Ayodhya is now not just the heart of India's spirituality; it is slowly transforming into an economic and tourism powerhouse. A simple comparison tells us about the scale of the tourism explosion in Ayodhya after the Ram temple was inaugurated in 2024. Last year, Ayodhya's footfall was 16.44 crore compared with Mecca's 1.4 crore (to be fair, Saudi limits the annual number of pilgrims



to the nerve centre of Islam). During Mayawati and Akhilesh Yadav's tenure, Ayodhya received merely two to three lakh visitors a year. This spectacular burst of tourism has, of course, brought with immense challenges. The city is struggling to accommodate the influx, leading to bottlenecks in transport, accommodation, and utilities. The Maharishi Valmiki International Airport's Phase 1 runway can handle only about a million passengers annually, causing flight backlogs during Ram Navami or Diwali. Daily waste generation has risen to 500-600 metric tons from 100 metric tons before 2024. Only 70 per cent of this is processed by new plants, leading to dumping near the riverfront during

peak season. Water supply shortages hit 40-50 per cent of households and guesthouses. But a deep state-Centre coordination, a grand and forwardlooking blueprint, and CM Yogi's special attention on Ayodhya make the challenges look surmountable. Right from entering office, Yogi put the file on Ayodhya's development at the top of the pile. He kicked it off with a stunningly pictur-esque and well-organised deepotsav. The blueprint for the city's development was drawn up, which included the historic Ram Mandir construction. This master plan envisages heritagesteeped Ayodhya to be a hi-tech city by 2031, besides becoming a global spiritual centre by



A costly reversal on green governance

The Supreme Court's recall of its judgement on retrospective environmental clearances is a setback to environmentally informed governance. On May 16, the Court held that ex post facto clearances by the government to building projects were a "gross illegality". A 2:1 majority ruling by Chief Justice B R Gavai and Justice Vinod Chandran has now reversed the earlier ruling - the Vanashakti judgement - and held that if allowed to operate, the verdict would have a 'devastating effect" and "thousands of crores of rupees would go to waste". Dissenting Justice Ujjal Bhuyan endorsed the earlier ruling and described the review judgement an "innocent expression of opinion" which overlooked the 'very fundamentals of environmental jurisprudence". The view held by Justice Bhuyan, who was part of the original verdict, presents a strong counterpoint to the majority ruling. It has been claimed that the recall is on technical grounds and merely addresses errors in the previous judgement. This is no validation for a post facto clearance regime, and the review judgement, it is argued, only lifts the stay on government notifications and procedures, thus avoiding wastage of investment of around Rs 20,000 crore.

There are 24 central projects worth Rs 8,293 crore and 29 state projects worth Rs 11,168 crore pending because of the earlier ruling. But when violations are validated in the form of post facto regularisation, the integrity of environmental governance comes under question. There are many precedents of courts, including the Supreme Court, ordering demolition of structures constructed in violation of environmental and civic regulations. An illegality should be treated as an illegality. Justice Bhuyan has adhered to the Court's consistent position on environmental issues.

Stop rewriting history Rammohan Roy was a revolutionary, not a British agent

When Madhya Pradesh higher education minister Inder Singh Parmar branded Raja Rammohan Roy a "British agent", he was not mistaken - he was intentional. This was not an amateurish slip, nor a provincial misunderstanding of history. It was a deliberate act of historical vandalism.

Such claims are not merely inaccurate; they reveal the deeper anxiety of a politics that cannot digest a Hindu reformer who combined reason, moral courage, and pluralism. As Ramachandra Guha notes in Rammohan Roy: The First Liberal of India, Roy embodied an Enlightenment spirit shaped indigenously. even as he engaged the world intellectually. To attack him today is to attack that liberal foundation. Rammohan Roy's real "crime" in today's ideological climate is straightforward: he represents a Hinduism of introspection, critique, and ethical universalism - qualities antithetical to the homogenising, militarised version of Hindu identity that Hindutva seeks to impose. Roy fought



against Sati, child marriage, polygamy, caste dogma, and religious superstition. He defended women's rights and championed modern education. His reformist thought, as

O.P. Dwivedi documents, was not derivative of British ideas but anchored in indigenous moral traditions that he reinterpreted with intellectual courage. He built a Hindu reform movement grounded in Vedantic ethics, not sectarian rage. This is precisely what today's ideologues cannot accommodate.

To call such a man a "British agent" is an act of moral and intellectual self-incrimination. The historical record flatly contradicts Parmar's caricature. Dipesh Chakrabarty, writing on Roy's role in the emergence of nationalist journalism, reminds us that Roy spearheaded India's first organised protest against colonial authority: the 1823 agitation against

press restrictions.

If he were serving the British, why did they suppress Mirat-ul-Akhbar, the Persian newspaper he used to challenge their policies? Why did

they fear his critiques of revenue extraction, missionary aggression, and administrative despotism? Why did he demand Indian participation in governance decades before the first stirrings of formal nationalism? Agents do not launch the subcontinent's first free-press movement against their supposed masters One of the laziest distortions is that Roy merely echoed colonial thinking on Sati.

The historical truth, buttressed by Dwivedi's meticulous research, is that Roy spent years campaigning, writing, petitioning, and mobilising public opinion against the practice. The British outlawed Sati in 1829 because Roy forced the question, not out of sudden moral enlightenment.

Tharoor cites Trump-Mamdani interaction to underline need for political cooperation

(Agency): Sharing visuals of the interaction between United States President Donald Trump and New York Mayor-designate Mamdani, Congress MP Shashi Tharoor has once again stirred debate within political circles, subtly urging India to embrace postelection collaboration among political rivals. Taking to his social media

handle, Tharoor wrote: "This is how democracy should work. Fight passionately for your point of view in elections, with no rhetorical holds barred. But once it's over, and the people have spoken, learn to cooperate with each other in the common interests of the nation you are both pledged to serve. I would love to see more of this in India -- and am trying to do my part." Tharoor's remarks are seen as a continuation of his previous controversial statement in



which he praised Prime Minister Narendra Modi's speech, despite the PM having sharply criticized the Congress at the time. Back then, Tharoor had argued that respecting the office of the Prime Minister and acknowledging the positives, even in opposition, was part of a "mature democratic approach". While his stance had triggered discomfort within sections

Congress, it also earned appreciation from some for promoting political civility. Tharoor's latest intervention follows a widely circulated video showing Donald Trump and Zohran Mamdani -- an Indian-origin designate of New York -sharing a cordial exchange at the White House. After the meeting, Trump praised Mamdani, saying he believed Mamdani would make "a very

and added that he would be happy to live in the city during Mamdani's tenure. He noted that many who voted for him had also supported Mamdani, and "Mamdani could surprise critics". Mamdani, in turn, said he was committed to working with the White House to improve the quality of life in New York and address key urban challenges. Tharoor used the interaction to reinforce his appeal for political cooperation, saying that democracy grows stronger when adversaries can work together on matters of public importance. His remarks have once again sparked discussion on the scope of bipartisanship in India's increasingly polarized political landscape. Drugs valued over Rs 4.79 crore seized in Mizoram; four arrested



Aizawl (Agency): The Border Security Force (BSF), in a joint operation with the Excise and Narcotics Department of Mizoram, has seized highly addictive methamphetamine tablets and heroin, worth over Rs 4.79 crore and arrested four drug peddlers, including two Myanmar nationals, on Saturday, officials said. A BSF spokesman said that the troops of the border guarding force of the Mizoram and Cachar frontier, acting on secret information, identified a house at Chandmari West in Aizawl. In the presence of two independent civil witnesses, a thorough search of the premises was conducted. Two suspected drug peddlers were found inside the house. On questioning, they voluntarily handed over two bags containing suspected narcotics. Subsequent examination revealed the bags contained six packages (5.89 kg) of Methamphetamine tablets and three soap cases (41 gm) of heroin, valued over Rs 4.79 crore. The consignment was seized by the Excise and Narcotics Department, Mizoram, and all four drug peddlers, including two Myanmar nationals, were apprehended. A BSF statement said that this successful operation stands as a testimony to the high degree of coordination, real-time information sharing, and seamless synergy between BSF Aizawl and the Excise and Narcotics Department, Mizoram.

Four drug peddlers arrested in Jammu

Jammu (Agency): Four drug peddlers were arrested in the rural area of Jammu, and a heroin-like substance, a car, a motorcycle and an electronic weighing scale were seized from their possession, police said on Saturday. A police statement said, "In a major against trafficking, Jammu (Rural) Police achieved a significant breakthrough with the arrest of four drug peddlers and the recovery of heroin-like substance, one car, one motorcycle, and an electronic weighing scale". residents of Jindrah, the police said. Accordingly, an FIR under relevant sections of the NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli for further investigation. Jammu Police reaffirmed its unwavering commitment to eliminating the menace of drugs from society and appealed to the public to information share any regarding drug-related activities with the nearest police station. The identity of the informants shall be kept confidential, the statement added. 

Pakistan: Death toll in Faisalabad factory blast rises to 20



Faisalabad (Agency): A powerful explosion at a chemical factory in Faisalabad's Malikpur area set off a massive fire and caused the collapse of ten nearby houses, killing at least 20 people and injuring seven others, local media reported on Saturday, quoting the rescue officials.

The blast erupted at a factory producing adhesives near Shahab Town's Kabaddi Stadium Ground and was powerful enough to be heard

the city. Within moments, flames engulfed the building and spread to adjacent homes, bringing down roofs and walls and trapping entire families beneath the debris, reports leading Pakistani daily, The Express Tribune. The dead include women, children, elderly residents and factory labourers. Rescue 1122 teams, backed by heavy machinery and 150 personnel, worked for ten hours to retrieve bodies and survivors under the supervision

of District Emergency Officer Engineer Ehtisham Wahla. According to local media reports, a total of 31 rescue vehicles were deployed to the scene. Traffic police ensured a clear route to Allied Hospital as the injured and deceased were transported, while the district administration declared an emergency at both Allied hospitals and called in senior doctors. Deputy Commissioner Faisalabad Captain (r) Nadeem Nisar, SSP Operations Nasser Mahmood Bajwa, the chief traffic officer and SP Madina Town monitored the rescue efforts on-site. Residents of Malikpur also joined emergency workers in removing rubble and helping victims. Additionally, Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz and National Assembly Speaker Sardar Ayaz Sadiq expressed deep grief over the tragedy and sought a detailed Faisalabad report from Commissioner Raja Jahangir

Bangladesh earthquake death toll climbs to 10

Dhaka (Agency): At least 10 people have died and more than 200 others were injured across Bangladesh after the 5.7magnitude earthquake struck the South Asian nation, causing widespread panic and structural damage, local media reported on Saturday. Four of the victims died in Dhaka, five in Narsingdi, and one in Narayanganj. In Dhaka, the fatalities occurred in Armanitola after the railing of a building's roof collapsed, killing three people and injuring several reports Bangladeshi newspaper, The Dhaka Tribune. In Narsingdi, five deaths were reported as the impact of the tremor rippled through the district.

The quake, which struck at 10:38 a.m. on Friday, measured 5.7 on the Richter scale according to the Bangladesh Meteorological Department, which identified its epicentre in Madhabdi, Narsingdi and described it as a moderate earthquake. More than 200 people sustained injuries in Dhaka, Narsingdi and Gazipur. The Directorate General of Health Services confirmed that 10 injured people were admitted to DMCH and 10 others to Shaheed Tajuddin



Medical College Hospital. Several Dhaka University students were seriously hurt after leaping from buildings in panic, with at least 10 students injured, some requiring hospitalisation. In Narsingdi, 45 people received treatment at the district hospital, with three transferred to DMCH in critical condition, while another 10 were treated at the Narsingdi 100-bed Hospital. In Gazipur's Sreepur area, more than 150 workers were injured in a stampede as they rushed out of throughout their homes.

Normalcy returns to Nepal's Bara after violent Gen-Z protests, security concerns remain



Bara (Agency): After two days of violent protest, Simara city in the Bara district of Nepal is returning to normalcy, with security seen as the major concern for locals ahead of the upcoming election. Tension started to flare up in Simara Chowk of Bara district after CPN-UML cadres charged at the Gen-Z protestors who were staging a peaceful protest on Wednesday. Tension continued for the second day, with Gen-Z protestors alleging that police had let those inciting violence go free. "On Wednesday and Inursday, the situation was quite tense here. The Gen-Z were on the street in large numbers and protesting. (District) Leaders of the CPN-UML had attacked the Gen-Z (District Coordinator) Samrat (Upadhyay), which flared up the tension, but since yesterday, the condition is returning to normalcy," Gopal Rijal, an auto rickshaw driver in Simara, told ANI. The situation continued to simmer after the police arrested three individuals, who included two elected ward chairs from the CPN-UML -- Dhan Bahadur Shrestha and Kaimuddin Ansari. Shrestha is the chair of Ward 2, while Ansari is of Ward 6. Another accused, Arvind Sah, named as the main perpetrator and planner of the attack on the Gen-Z group, was arrested in Hetauda on Thursday night. "The situation around here had started to fall back to normal since yesterday morning. There hasn't been any violence or clashes since yesterday. The Gen-Z groups had gone for talks with the authorities in Pathlaiya. The situation has continued to remain normal; there isn't an environment of fear till now," said Lokendra Prasad Baral, another resident of Simara, to ANI as he continued his business on Saturday

Dhaka (Agency): Bangladesh on Saturday rolled out a red carpet for Bhutanese Prime Minister Tshering Tobgay, who arrived in Dhaka this morning for a two-day state visit. Bangladesh's Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus received him after a Drukair flight carrying the Bhutanese leader landed at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport (HSIA) around 8:15 am (Local time). The two leaders held a brief meeting at the airport's VIP lounge, where Prime Minister Tobgay inquired about the damage and loss of lives caused by Friday's earthquake and expressed his condolences to the families of the victims. Following the meeting, Tobgay was escorted to a makeshift saluting dais, where he was accorded a 19-gun salute and a guard of honour. Trump's long-time ally Marjorie Greene says she will resign after losing his support


Washington (Agency): Marjorie Taylor Greene, one of President Donald Trump's closest political allies, has announced that she will resign from the US Congress. Her decision comes iust a week after Trump publicly withdrew his endorsement for her re-election bid. Greene made the announcement late on Friday through a detailed statement posted on X. She said she had grown increasingly frustrated with the political atmosphere in Washington and accused both major parties of operating what she called a "Political Industrial Complex." "Americans are used by the Political Industrial Complex of both political parties, election cycle after election cycle, in order to elect whichever side



can convince Americans to hate the other side more," she wrote. "And the results are always the same, nothing ever gets better for the common American man or woman." Saying she had "never fit in" in Washington, Greene added that the political system was designed to divide Americans rather than solve problems. She said she intends to "fight for the people of this country in a different way." Greene confirmed

that her last day in office will be January 5, 2026. A strong MAGA supporter for years, Greene has been one of the most outspoken Republican lawmakers. Her resignation comes as her relationship with Trump has sharply deteriorated, especially after he withdrew support for her political future. Earlier this month, Greene expressed deep frustration and shock over Trump's public comments, saying his attacks had intensified threats to her safety and forced her to seek private security. "I am now being contacted by private security firms with warnings for my safety as a hot bed of threats against me are being fueled and egged on by the most powerful man in the world.

Russia ready to discuss new Ukraine peace plan in detail: Putin



Moscow (Agency): Russia is ready for a substantive discussion of the details of a new USproposed 28-point peace plan on Ukraine, Russian President Vladimir Putin said. Putin said Russia has received the plan through channels

Kyiv (Agency): Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said that his country is facing "one of the most difficult moments" in its history as it considers the US-proposed 28point peace plan. "We are now in one

of the most difficult moments in our history. The pressure on Ukraine is at its heaviest. Ukraine could now face a very difficult choice: either the loss of dignity, or the risk of losing a key partner. Either the difficult 28 points, or an extremely difficult winter," Zelensky said in his address to the nation. The next week will be very challenging and full of events, Zelensky said, noting that he plans to propose alternatives to amend the US plan and that Ukraine's interests must be taken into account in the document, Xinhua news agency reported. Zelensky stressed that he will present arguments, persuade, and offer alternatives but will not give the enemy any reason to claim that Ukraine does not want peace.

China takes Japan's Taiwan remarks to UN as tensions rise

(Agency): Tension between China and Japan has sharply escalated after Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi made strong remarks in parliament early this month about a possible security threat from China over Taiwan. Beijing has now taken the matter to the United Nations, accusing Japan of making "erroneous" statements, Global Times reported. China's Permanent Representative to the UN, Fu Cong, on Friday wrote a formal letter to UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, outlining Beijing's position on the "erroneous words and



deeds" of Japanese Prime Minister Takaichi concerning Taiwan. The letter responds to Takaichi's comments on November 7, where she said that any "use of force on Taiwan" by China could "survivalthreatening situation" for Japan. Following these comments, China reimposed its recently lifted ban on Japanese seafood imports and issued a travel alert for Chinese citizens visiting Japan. Fu said in his letter that Takaichi's comments were unprecedented since Japan's surrender in 1945. According to him, this is the first time a Japanese leader has linked Taiwan to Japan's collective self-defence rights and suggested armed involvement. He described her remarks as "extremely

erroneous, highly dangerous, and extremely malicious." He added that Japan had ignored China's repeated protests and continued defending its position. Calling the remarks a violation of international law and a challenge to the post-war order, Fu said the statements were offensive to "more than 1.4 billion Chinese people" as well as Asian nations that suffered under Japanese aggression during World War II, Global Times reported. "The letter will be issued as an official document of the UN General Assembly and distributed to all member states," as per Global Times.

The State Bank of India, a premier multinational private sector bank, said that cumulative exports to the USA also registered a growth of 13pc to USD 45 billion in FY26 Apr-September from USD 40 billion in FY 25 from April-September, though there could be more frontloading effects to the aftermath, with

So, by enabling collateral-free credit access under the Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE), govt. focused on strengthening liquidity and improving business operations since the tariffs have led to a steep drop in container volume of shipments to the United States. On the Balance of Payments (BoP) basis, India's current account deficit placed at 0.2pc of GDP in Q1 FY26, as against 0.1pc in Q1FY25. This improvement was mainly due to robust services exports and a strong flow of remittances.

Afghan commerce minister calls for bolstering trade and sectoral cooperation with India

fghan Commerce Minister Alhaj Noorudin Azizi on Friday extended an open invitation to Indian businesses to participate in sectors such as mining, agriculture, healthcare, pharmaceuticals, IT, energy and textiles. Azizi also expressed his heartfelt appreciation for India's longstanding support of Afghanistan, especially in challenging times. He

also announced several new initiatives, including a 1 per cent tariff on raw materials and machinery, free land allocations, a reliable power supply, and five-year tax exemptions for new industries, particularly those established by Afghan refugees. While addressing a joint session at PHDCCI here, the commerce minister also urged greater engagement from the Afghan Sikh and Hindu communities. He reaffirmed Afghanistan's commitment to ensuring a peaceful, inclusive, and

business-friendly environment for all partners. Also, M. Anand Prakash, Joint Secretary (PAI) of the Ministry of External Affairs, highlighted recent developments that will boost trade, including the activation of air freight corridors between Kabul and major Indian cities, which are poised to begin cargo operations soon.

He also underscored the deep civilisational ties between the two nations and announced the reactivation of the Joint Working Group on Trade, Commerce, and Investment. Representing the business community, Vardaan Aggarwal, vice president of Dynasty Oil, acknowledged the strong momentum in bilateral trade, which touched approximately USD 1 billion in 2024-25, with India importing USD 689 million from Afghanistan and exporting USD 318 million. He emphasised the shared ambition to scale trade to USD 2 billion by 2030, driven by enhanced B2B engagements, joint ventures and improved connectivity.

This means that six ministry positions are vacant. Speculation is rife that the cabinet expansion will take place after the announcement of the new state president. A senior political analyst says, "The BJP's landslide victory in the Bihar elections will have repercussions in Uttar Pradesh as well. The way the high command is prioritizing Keshav Prasad Maurya suggests he has an edge over other rivals. With an upper-caste CM, the party will likely bet on an OBC candidate. As for Brajesh Pathak's candidacy, there's considerable doubt about his name.

Under the UNEP Be Cool Project, funded by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, Tamil Nadu is implementing the Green Schools Initiative across 197 government schools, targeting heat resilience through passive cooling and nature-based solutions. The state is also set to become the first in India to mandate minimum passive cooling standards in all new buildings. District cooling is being embedded into city- and statelevel plans, promoting energy-efficient, climate-resilient cooling infrastructures. Africa, will create a major hurdle in crafting a joint communique. Organisers have already scaled back the ambition of the final outcome, aware that Washington will not be present to underwrite major initiatives. For South Africa, hosting Africa's first G20 summit, the snub has immediate reputational and financial implications. Pretoria risks losing momentum at a moment when it seeks to project its leadership of Africa and the wider Global South. The vacuum created can easily be turned into an opening for China, the world's second largest economy and for Russia which would like to perceived as the world power it was during the Soviet era. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's full-throated participation, in sharp contrast to Washington's disengagement. could also elevate New Delhi's standing as one of the few major powers consistently invested in the G20's future. "Probably it's a good time for other powers ranging from China to Europe to even us, to try take decisions which will help the global economies and to the global south," said former Secretary in the Ministry of External Affairs Pinak Ranjan Chakravarty. However, it's to be seen how the G20 will navigate through the thorny topics of climate change mitigation, reworking critical mineral supply chains so that one single country is unable to dominate commerce in the raw materials needed to shape a greener earth or for that matter in the global desire to police and control the new frontier of artificial intelligence. In some ways, diplomats say issues at the heart of the Global South, debt restructuring, equitable climate finance, digital public goods, and early steps toward AI governance, now face fewer obstacles without a dominant US voice steering priorities elsewhere. However, without US acceptance of decisions taken at Johannesburg, it is to be seen whether those very decisions can or will be implemented or for that matter accepted by the larger comity of nations. Diplomats tracking the summit say the shift could accelerate a broader tilt toward a more multipolar order, or worse, toward fragmented parallel institutions such as BRICS, which India, China, Russia and South Africa have long championed but which have yet to take the heft of structured and accepted institutions such as the G7 or G20.

New deep-sea 'Octopus Squid'...

Dr. Sajikumar K. K. "We have been studying cephalopods in the Arabian Sea for more than a decade, and this 'octopus squid' was something we had never encountered," said Dr. Sasikumar. Until now, Taningia danae, found in Atlantic waters, was the only recognized species in this genus. "DNA barcoding showed more than 11 percent genetic divergence from the Atlantic species, confirming it as a distinct species," she added. Explaining the unusual traits of the genus, Dr. Sajikumar noted: "Though called the 'octopus squid', it is actually a squid with only eight arms and no tentacles. Members of this family can grow very large, with the Atlantic species reaching up to 2.3 metres in length and weighing around 61.4 kg." The new species has been named in honour of eminent marine biologist Dr. E. G. Silas, former CMFRI Director and former Vice Chancellor of Kerala Agricultural University, and a pioneer of cephalopod research in India. Research scholars Dr. Shijin Ameri and Toil Thomas also contributed to the finding. Nearly 400 squid species have been documented worldwide, inhabiting environments ranging from shallow coasts to deep-sea trenches.

proposals for Metro Rail systems in Coimbatore and Madurai and urge him to instruct the MoHUA to reconsider the decision. He said Tamil Nadu, being the most urbanised State in the country with a high per-capita private vehicle ownership, needs highcapacity public transport alternatives in all its large growth engine cities. "Towards this, we had prepared the DPRs for Coimbatore and Madurai Metro Rails and forwarded the same to MoHUA for approval", he said. "Considering the high priority accorded to these two projects, we were continuously following up with the relevant Ministry", the Chief Minister said recalled his earlier meeting with Mr Modi on May 24 and July 26 and submitted a memorandum on our priority requests. Mr Stalin said "in this backdrop, the rejection of this request has taken us by complete surprise and has created deep resentment amongst the people of the two cities that their deserving needs have been rejected, as compared to similar projects sanctioned in other States." Observing that the purported reasons quoted in the communication from MoHUA are not appropriate, he said the criterion of 2 million population, as in the Metro Rail Policy 2017, has been quoted as one of the main reasons for rejection. Highlighting that the population of Coimbatore LPA area had exceeded two million way back in 2011 itself and in the case of Madurai too, the expected population is likely to exceed it now, Mr Stalin said it was pertinent to point out at this juncture that if this two million criteria had been applied uniformly, many Metros in Tier-II cities like Agra, Indore and Patna might not have materialised. "The selective application of this criterion to our proposal has created an impression of discrimination against our cities and union Government needs to dispel it by treating our cities on par with the cities mentioned above", he added. The

Chief Miniser said in addition, the adequacy of ridership for the

project in Coimbatore city has been arrived at by comparing with the ridership of Chennai. This is not appropriate since ridership depends upon multiple factors. Pointing out that both these cities have commuting patterns different from Chennai, Mr Stalin said the Comprehensive Mobility Plan (CMP) for Coimbatore prepared by RITES after detailed traffic studies had clearly projected the need for MRTS in the proposed sectors. For Madurai also, the CMP of 2011 had proposed BRT but since most of the route length would have to be elevated, it had clearly mentioned that the railbased system can also be considered, he said. Further, the DPR studies have made subsequent independent assessments of traffic projections, which justified the need for Metro Rail corridors, the Chief Minister said, adding, these factors have not been adequately taken into consideration. He said with reference to the availability of right of way, it is well known that Metro Rail projects have necessitated acquisition of private lands in most cities in India. "We are fully conscious of the need for balancing social costs due to land acquisition with the long term socio-economic benefits from Metro Rail projects. We have been offering compensation which meets the expectations of the land owners in our current project and we will ensure that the availability of land will not be a hindrance for the proposed projects at Coimbatore and Madurai cities", the Chief Minister assured. "In this scenario, I have advised the Department of Special Initiatives to submit detailed justifications on the issues raised by MoHUA. Crawley joins unwanted list after pair of ducks in Perth Ashes Test

joined the unwanted company of English openers to bag a pair of ducks in an Ashes Test following another dismissal to pacer Mitchell Starc during the first Ashes Test at Perth's Optus Stadium on Saturday. Tasked with providing England with an explosive start to expand their 40-run lead further, Crawley once again fell to Starc in the first over, thanks to an excellent onehanded grab from the veteran Aussie left-armer. Previously, in the first innings, he had nicked the delivery at slips to Usman Khawaja. Now, he has joined Trevor Bailey (Melbourne in 1959), Dennis Amiss (Adelaide in 1975), and Michael Atherton (Melbourne in 1998) as the fourth English opener to bag a pair of ducks in an Ashes Test. This is also the first instance of a wicket falling before a run was scored in each of the first three innings of a Test, with Crawley and Jake Weatherald falling for ducks in previous innings without a run added to the scorecard for their teams. This year in seven Tests, Crawley has made 414 runs in 12 innings at an average of 34.50, with a strike rate of over 63, including a century, three fifties and a best score of



124. After Australia was bundled out for 132 in response to England's first innings total of 172, a half-century stand between Ollie Pope and Ben Duckett put England in front with a 99-run lead at the end of the first session on day two. At the end of the session's play, England was 59/1, with Duckett (28*) and Pope (24*) unbeaten. Earlier, Australia started the day two at 123/9, with Brendan Doggett

unbeaten at 3* and o* respectively. Lyon and Doggett rotated strike to eat further into the deficit, but a fine catch from Ben Duckett at gully ended Australia's inning at 132 in 45.2 overs, and they trailed by 40 runs. Skipper Ben Stokes (5/23) was the leading wicket-taker for England, getting crucial wickets of Travis Head (21 in 35 balls, with a four) and Cameron Green (24 in 50 balls, with two fours), who were putting a partnership after the Aussies were restricted to 31/4. However, it was a pace and bounce exhibition from Brydon Carse (3/45) and Jofra Archer (2/11), which gave early jitters to Australians, as they lost debutant opener Jake Weatherald (0), Marnus Labuschagne (9), Steve Smith (17) and Usman Khawaja (2) quickly. Leading by 40 runs, England were at an advantage. It was upto openers Zak Crawley and Ben Duckett to stretch that advantage as far as possible in terms of runs. But a brilliant one-handed grab from Mitchell Starc gave England another first-over jolt and Crawley a pair of ducks. England was 0/1 in 0.5 overs. The pair of Ollie Pope and Ben Duckett stabilised the innings yet again.

Abu Dhabi T10: Moeen Ali's late assault powers Ajman Titans to six-wicket win over Northern Warriors

Bavuma's quiet captaincy, no superstars: Jonty Rhodes on SA's resurgence



New Delhi (Agency): South Africa's rise in Test cricket has been anything but ordinary. When conversations turn to dominance in the longest format, the spotlight usually falls on India or Australia-teams with established legacies, depth, and consistency. Yet, over the past few years, South Africa has quietly constructed a compelling case for itself, emerging not with loud declarations but with steady, resolute performances across formats. Their resurgence wasn't a sudden burst but a slow build rooted in resilience. Final appearances in the 2024 T20 World Cup and the 2025 Women's ODI World Cup, along with a semifinal run in the 2023 ODI World Cup, had already shown signs of a shift. For decades, the "chokers" tag shadowed South African cricket, but the Temba Bavuma-led side decisively buried that narrative by winning their first-ever World Test Championship title for the 2023-2025 cycle-beating Australia, no less, in a performance etched in history. Crucially, that landmark achievement did not mark the end of their upward trajectory. South Africa carried their momentum into unfamiliar and challenging conditions. After falling 1-0 behind in Pakistan. they levelled the series with conviction in Rawalpindi. From there, they travelled to India the toughest away examination in modern Test cricket - and stunned the hosts with an emphatic win in the first Test in Kolkata. Now, in Guwahati, they arrive not as underdogs but as genuine contenders. The belief underpinning this side mirrors the transformation former Indian captain Virat Kohli once envisioned for his own team: a unit capable of competing anywhere in the world.

USA cricketer charged for ICC anti-corruption code breach

Abu Dhabi (Agency): USA cricketer Akhilesh Reddy, who played for the UP Nawabs in the ongoing Abu Dhabi T10 2025 tournament, has been provisionally suspended after being charged by the International Cricket Council (ICC) with three breaches of the Anti-Corruption Code. The charges were announced on November 21, and Reddy has been given 14 days from that date to respond to the allegations. The ICC confirmed that it is acting on behalf of the Emirates Cricket Board during the proceedings. The 25-year-old cricketer faces allegations that include attempting to fix or improperly influence a match, soliciting or encouraging another person to engage in fixing, and obstructing or delaying an investigation by deleting data or messages from a mobile device. The



provisional suspension takes effect immediately and prevents Reddy from participating in any cricketrelated activities until the process is complete. Reddy, who debuted for the USA earlier this year and played four matches in the North America T20 Cup, has seen his career interrupted as the ICC pursues its investigation.
